## A Dickens of a day out!

The late arrival into Grantham of the 09.21 LNER Kings Cross service meant that the present writer and his wife were obliged to break into a fair trot to reach St Pancras station in time for the 10.52 Javelin [Hitachi Class 395] train to Rochester using the High Speed line via Stratford International and Ebbsfleet before switching to the North Kent and Chatham main line for Gravesend and Strood then crossing the Medway to enter our destination.

The cathedral at Rochester stands immediately opposite the railway station with the Norman castle to its right and the Medway to the right of the castle. The cathedral we see today was built by Bishop Gundulf between 1077 and 1130 although the cathedral has a much earlier foundation as far back as 604 just a few years after Augustine had landed in Kent and settled at Canterbury.

Coffee is served in the crypt which is home also to the most beautiful chapel dedicated to St Ithamar – born in Kent and in 644 became the first Anglo-Saxon bishop in England when he was consecrated Bishop of Rochester.

The crypt is also home to the 'Textus Roffensis' which contains the earliest written copy of the first code of English law and was written in Rochester in the 1120's.

Anthony Wilson Thorold, born 13th June 1825 in what is now the Old Rectory at Hougham, was the son of the Reverend Edward Thorold [Rector of the family living of Hougham cum Marston] who in turn was the younger son of Sir John Thorold 9<sup>th</sup> Baronet of Syston Park. In 1877 Anthony Wilson Thorold was consecrated Bishop of Rochester at a time when the diocese was re-constituted to accommodate the population of south London and the suburbs across parts of Kent and Surrey. Hougham has the travelling case of the Bishop of Rochester and henceforth Anthony Wilson Thorold signs his letters 'A W Roffen'.

The High Street of Rochester is a single straight Roman road which carried what we might call the A2 over the Medway and on towards London. The Crown provided a good spot for lunch with fine views west over the river while a short riverside walk brought us into the grounds of the Norman castle and so back to the cathedral. The High Street had the usual mix of charity shops and cafes plus an excellent second-hand bookshop so we were able to equip ourselves with a good copy of 'The Mystery of Edwin Drood' – Dickens last novel [unfinished at his death in 1870] and which is set in Rochester thinly disguised as Cloisterham.

Between the cathedral and the railway station stands the Huguenot Museum where the story is told of the Huguenot refugees who found a safe haven in Britain following the Revocation of the Edict of Nantes in 1685 and their persecution in and escape from France. One of the skills the Huguenots brought with them was as weavers of silk and they established themselves in the district of Spitalfields to the east of the City of London

Spitalfields silks were widely exported and a pre-eminent designer of the silk was a 'local lass' Anna Maria Garthwaite born 1688 in the rectory at Harston where her father the Reverend Ephraim Garthwaite was rector, granddaughter to the Reverend Ephraim Garthwaite of Barkston and great-granddaughter to the Reverend Miles Garthwaite of Fulbeck . Anna Maria in fact created over 1,000 designs for woven silk over a period of three decades and has been called the 'pre-eminent silk designer of her period'.

All this was accomplished in time to catch the returning Javelin at 17.29 to St Pancras and the onward 18.33 LNER service to Grantham on which we enjoyed complimentary drinks and an early evening meal! With every good wish. Stuart Hadley (Rector)

## **BARKSTON AND SYSTON PARISH COUNCIL**

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on 13<sup>th</sup> January. Eight members of the Parish Council were present, together with Councillor Ray Wootten (County Council). Parish Councillor Peter Connor and District Councillors Mrs Rosemary Kaberry-Brown and Ian Stokes sent apologies. There were no members of the public present.

The Clerk, as usual, updated members on the progress with various matters in connection with roads and footpaths, which had been raised at previous meetings. In particular, it was noted that enforcement of the waiting restrictions did not appear to have taken place, despite requests and several reminders to the Police and County Council Parking Services. The Clerk was asked to remind the relevant authorities about the need for enforcement, and also to contact the County Councillor responsible for highways.

A letter had been received from a local resident in relation to issues connected to speeding through the village on the A607, the Community Speedwatch scheme and parking on bus stops. This was discussed thoroughly, and the Clerk was asked to request that consideration be given by the County Council to additional traffic regulations to prevent parking on bus stops; and in the meantime to ask the Police to organise regular checks to prevent such parking.

The Council discussed the latest position in regard to the suggested Community Speedwatch Scheme. Following publicity, eight residents had expressed a willingness to help in the scheme, which with the two from Belton & Manthorpe formed a useful group to run the scheme. Belton & Manthorpe had agreed to participate in the scheme, and the formal applications had been submitted from both Councils. The next steps would be a training session for the volunteers and the erection of warning signs at intervals along the A607. Following a discussion on the inclusion of a further reactive sign, and the purchase of wheelie bin 'reminder' stickers, it was agreed to take no further action.

Various results and comments made in regard to planning applications were reported. In regard to the picnic area, the County Council had now contacted the Parish Council in regard to completing the legalities connected with the transfer of the land.
