Not From the Rectory – or in this case John XXIII, Emma's Baptism and the Diocese of Lincoln's Environmental Policy

Pope John XXIII [1958-63] inaugurated a new era in the Roman Catholic Church with his policy of openness and it was he who called the Second Vatican Council and today the English speaking Catholic church in Geneva is named for him and was our destination in September 2019 for the baptism of the newest member of our family, Emma Margaret; and having regard to the Diocese of Lincoln's Environmental Policy we opted to take the train rather than fly!

In the first instance it was LNER to King's Cross and then from St Pancras to Paris Gare du Nord by Eurostar where we took a taxi across the city to Paris Gare de Lyons where we boarded the TGV-Lyria 200mph double deck [Duplex] train for Geneva. The café bar on the upper deck offers the best views of the scenery. The TGV travels south east from Paris on the high-speed line as far as Bourg en Bresse where it slows to take the Haut-Bugey line which has been rebuilt to mainline standards in a joint French-Swiss project after having been partially closed in 1990.

Trains for Geneva have previously detoured south but this line shortens the distance by 47km and offers the passenger views of mountainous terrain, some inaccessible by road, through eleven tunnels and over eighty bridges and viaducts including the spectacular Cize-Bolozon viaduct over the Ain Gorge, a structure partly blown up by the French Resistance in 1944 and which took five years to repair.

The Baptism at the Church of St John XXIII was within the Sunday Mass where the priest reiterated in his homily that disciples of Christ must 'count the cost [of being disciples] and pay the price'. The church is close to the United Nations building and there was at least one diplomat in the congregation with his/her car displaying its 'C.D.' plate. The church was celebrating the bicentenary of the present Diocese of Lausanne and Geneva to which in 1924 Fribourg was added as this is where the diocesan bishop has his residence. The official commemoration was on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> September, the patronal festival of the diocese because the Cathedral of Our Lady of Lausanne is dedicated to the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The baptism of Emma Margaret was followed by a family meal a few miles out from Geneva at the Chateau de Bossey – an ecumenical institute overlooking Lake Geneva and which was acquired by the World Council of Churches in 1946, the chateau itself dating back to the first half of the eighteenth century.

This letter will come out in the January issue of 'In Touch' and I take the opportunity of wishing you all a happy and peaceful New Year. In the words of William Temple: Grant, O Lord, that as the years change, we may find rest in your eternal changelessness. May we meet this new year bravely, sure in the faith that, while men and women come and go, and life changes around us, you are always the same, guiding us with your wisdom, and protecting us with your love.

The Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book 2020

*Saying Yes to Life* (Ruth Valerio; SPCK) was commissioned by Archbishop Justin and is his chosen book for Lent 2020.

It imaginatively connects the days of creation with today's ethical, environmental and social concerns. It lifts us from our daily lives, to issues which impact millions around the world. As people made in the image of God, we are entrusted to look after what God has made and to share in the joy and creativity of God, who sees his creation and names it good.

Asked to produce something theological in depth and global in scope, Ruth's book is reflective and practical while also a stirring call to action and contemplation. Archbishop Justin says 'Ruth Valerio's book is perfect for individuals and groups to think, reflect, pray and be challenged together'. Each chapter contains prayers and discussion questions to be used by groups meeting in Lent, with additional study resources and interviews available via a dedicated website.

Complementing this book, the Church of England has developed a #LiveLent Care for God's Creation campaign on social media. For the first time, the Lent book and digital campaign support each other, with emails, apps, web links and booklets for both adults and children that contain daily bite-sized reflections and actions. We can all join in!

## **BARKSTON AND SYSTON PARISH COUNCIL**

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on 11<sup>th</sup> November. Seven members of the Parish Council were present, together with Councillor Ian Stokes (District Council). Parish Councillors Steve Elnor and Sue Evans, District Councillor Mrs Rosemary Kaberry-Brown and County Councillor Ray Wootten sent apologies. There were no members of the public present.

The Clerk, as usual, updated members on the progress with various matters in connection with roads and footpaths, which had been raised at previous meetings. In particular, it was noted that the double yellow lines were now all in place, following the approval of the waiting restriction order. 'School keep clear' markings had also been installed. The Clerk was asked to remind the relevant authorities about the need for enforcement.

The Council discussed the latest position in regard to the suggested Community Speedwatch Scheme. Publicity had been undertaken, to encourage volunteers to operate the scheme and as a result six residents had come forward, although more were required. The Clerk advised that Belton & Manthorpe had also publicised the scheme and so far had two volunteers. It was agreed that the proposed scheme would be a good deterrent to speeding through the village, and it was agreed to proceed with the scheme, subject to Belton & Manthorpe Parish Council confirming their participation at their meeting on 27<sup>th</sup> November.

Various results and comments made in regard to planning applications were reported. It was noted that the applicant for development at 12 West Street, Barkston had now appealed following the District Council's refusal.

There was still no answer from the County Council in regard to the picnic area land and the Clerk was asked to send a reminder.

The Woodland Trust had confirmed that the Council's request for some additional beech hedging to fill in gaps in the Burial Ground hedge had been agreed. The plants would be delivered in March 2020. The next meeting is on Monday, 13<sup>th</sup> January 2020 at 7.45 p.m. in the VILLAGE HALL.
