### **South Cliff Villages Group** NOT FROM THE RECTORY



Not from the Rectory - A Lincolnshire Steeplechase part 1

This steeplechase involves no horses but concentrates rather on the steeples [towers and spires] of Lincolnshire as may be glimpsed form the carriage window of a railway train subject to the limitations imposed by tunnels and cuttings!

The expedition starts with the journey south [fast] to Peterborough with the map open at the ready plus note book to glimpse in turn Great Ponton, Burton Coggles, Corby Glen, Swayfield, Creeton, Little Bytham and Carlby before crossing the county's boundary.

The second leg is at the more sedate pace set by an East Midlands single carriage train heading north to Lincoln; leaving the main line at Werrington it crosses the River Welland to enter the county with Deeping St Nicholas off to the left and a glimpse of Crowland Abbey some way off to the right: this is a journey across the flat fen land of the county with just Deeping St Nicholas to note before the train slows to enter Spalding [Victorian St John's as well as the ancient parish church of St Mary and St Nicholas] for one of its 4 intermediate stops.

Continuing north the line runs parallel to the A152 and the familiar succession of churches includes Pinchbeck, Surfleet, Gosberton, Quadring and Donington before crossing the South Forty Foot Drain to pass the fine spire and flying buttresses of Helpringham with the windmill at Heckington just visible before the train slows and enters Sleaford [St Denys] by the Grade 11\* listed Bass maltings.

The train navigates the 'back side' of Sleaford to regain the avoiding line and continue its way with stops at Ruskington and Metheringham as well as glimpses of Dorrington, Digby, Rowston,

Scopwick, Dunstan, Nocton, Potterhanworth and Heighington before entering Lincoln through its less salubrious industrial hinterland a world away from the cathedral atop the cliff.

The return train ran non-stop to Newark North Gate passing St Mary le Wigford at the top of High Street but thereafter the steeple-spotter can relax his vigilance: the train passes through the nature reserve at Whisby where the nightingale did sing one very cold morning a year or so ago and before the train reaches Newark there are the Nottinghamshire delights of Holme [whose medieval church is 'perfection' in the words of Henry Thorold in his Shell Guide to the county] and Winthorpe with its red brick Victorian church and broach spire

The final leg soon brings the traveller back into Lincolnshire passing the Rural Dean's church at Claypole but keeping its best delights to the end: with the setting sun forming a back drop to Marston's church with its 'broach spire and the ancient house of the Thorolds next door' [Lincolnshire by Henry Thorold 1996] and finally that most splendid of spires at St Wulfram's Grantham which one church dignitary insisted his fellow travellers acknowledge by raising their top hats as the train in which they were passengers raced through – today's train stopping to return the present writer to his starting point.

The Annual Meeting of the parish church received the accounts for the year to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2018 which painted a very sorry picture: we had met our expenditure of the year of £12,777 with income of the year of £9,419 and with drawing down on our small reserves of £3,358

With only £8,783 in the bank it is easy to see that if this situation continues unchecked through 2019 and 2020 it would then be a case of shutting the door – a situation we are confident the village does not want to see

We value our parish church not only as the physical centre, in some way, of Barkston but as the place we turn to for those significant life events in our family – the baptism or christening of the new born baby, the marriage of a young couple, the funeral rites of a much loved parent or grandparent. We saw on the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ending of the First World War how the parish church was the natural focus for the community's act of remembrance and indeed this is repeated each year on Remembrance Sunday.

To meet the running costs of the church we rely on the generosity of the regular congregation but also of the wider village community and of those who visit us from time to time. #### BARKSTON AND SYSTON PARISH COUNCIL

A meeting of the Parish Council was held on 11<sup>th</sup> March. Eight members of the Parish Council were present, together with District Councillors Rosemary Kaberry-Brown and Stokes. Parish Councillor Steve Elnor sent apologies.

One member of the public attended.

Prior to the commencement of the meeting, the Chairman referred to the fact that the meeting would be Councillor Jackson's last, as he had indicated that he would not be standing at the forthcoming elections. She mentioned that he had been a member since 1978, and Vice-Chairman and Chairman for a number of years, and made a small presentation in recognition of this service.

Many issues which had been raised about roads and footpaths were updated by the Clerk. Outstanding pothole repairs had been carried out, but those in Syston, which had been reported for further attention, as the filling was pulling out, had been advised by the County Council as temporary, due to the location. More permanent repairs would ideally be done, however cost prohibited this. Repairs would be monitored as part of routine inspections.

The proposed 50 mph speed limit between Manthorpe and Barkston was now in operation, and the consultation was taking place into a reduction in the 40 mph limit leading up to Manthorpe Church to 30 mph.

Complaints had been received that pedestrians waiting to cross the A607 at the central refuge on the A607 near the garage in Barkston were forced to wait too near to the edge of the road owing to nearby vegetation and overgrown verges. The County Council had agreed to remove vegetation and had suggested that the Parish Council ask the Lincs Road Safety Partnership to undertake a safety audit.

The action requested in regard to the area around the War Memorial, Barkston, where the road edges were wearing away up into the bank, was still being assessed, and no further information was available at the present. Similarly no further information was available in regard to suggested action on the matters raised about the West Street issues.

Councillor Jackson reported that he had met a Highways Department representative to discuss issues raised as long ago as 2008 in regard to the road verges in front of the Almshouses, but that nothing had been heard since the meeting. It was agreed that the Clerk would write reinforcing the

Well Walk Manthorpe Cllr Hallam spoke to this item, stating that she was concerned about the upkeep of this walk and it was in a poor state of repair and a Health and Safety hazard. LCC had recently attended, assessed the relevant risk, and completed work to make the top step safe

**Dog Fouling** – **Longcliffe Rd.** – Cllr Knight had asked this to be put on the Agenda, but she was not at the meeting this item to be carried forward to the next meeting.

Broken Manhole Covers Cllr Thornton stated that a number of manhole covers between Belton Woods Hotel and the Belton Lane junction, were in a poor state of repair and a trip hazard, some had been repaired since the last meeting, but there was still one that is a trip hazard. Clerk CM to follow up, again

**Speed Limit Manthorpe village** – District Cllr Ray Wootten had taken this to LCC and the matter was now out for consultation, with a view to getting the limit through Manthorpe village and Low Road reduced.

**Accounts.** CM updated the meeting re the accounts and circulated the Income/Expenditure since the last meeting. Movement on the accounts had been minimal, resolved accounts accepted by the members.

**Parish Council Elections:** CM informed the meeting that SKDC had arranged training re the Elections on 6<sup>th</sup> March at the Guildhall. This was primarily for Clerks but Cllrs were also invited to attend. Cllr Thompson and Cllr Hallam stated they would like to attend. Further meeting arranged for Wed 20<sup>th</sup> March at 7 p.m. at Belton for CM to discuss and pass on the relevant info to the Cllrs and to take in the relevant nomination forms from the Cllrs when completed.

**Belton Liaison Comm.** Cllr Syddall, updated the meeting on the Belton Liaison Comm. Meetings on 19<sup>th</sup> November and 4<sup>th</sup> February 2019. The minutes, would be attached to these minutes/notes and would be placed on the P.C. website by CM (when trained to do so), four hard copies would be needed for Belton villagers who do not have email. National Trust to be asked to produce the hard copies, and ST agreed to distribute in Belton, as required. Tony Hopwell had now retired from this group and the P.C. asked that their thanks be recorded for all the work Tony had done with this group.

Planning applications since the last meeting and Biomass Boiler - Biomass boiler dealt with under six above, and that SKDC had put an extension to the planning application to 28<sup>th</sup> February, due to the number of letters they had received re this application. CM updated the meeting, stating that there have been a number of applications submitted to SKDC, of which copies have been circulated via email, or he had spoken directly to Cllr Sally Thompson.
