

Not From the Rectory - A Lincolnshire Steeplechase Part 3

Taking the train we can enter the county from the south [Cambridgeshire], and from the west [Nottinghamshire], and from the north west [Yorkshire] from Doncaster where we can leave in a south easterly direction [as previously reported] or as in the present case in a north easterly direction taking a Trans Pennine Express headed for Cleethorpes and entering Lincolnshire shortly before Crowle with its medieval church and carving supposedly of St Oswald and King Oswy

The train runs alongside the Stainforth and Keadby Canal before crossing the River Trent to come into Scunthorpe with its Victorian parish church of St John [1889]. The station in fact is near to the former village of Frodingham which has a 13th century church dedicated to St Lawrence. It was good to see signs of activity at the Corus steel works before the train crossed the Worlaby and Elsham Carrs [area of bog or fen in which scrub [willow] has become established] and joined the lines from Gainsborough and Market Rasen at Barnetby Junction

Today was the opportunity to leave the train at Grimsby and await the single carriage Northern Rail service to Barton on Humber which is promoted as the 'Barton Line' and which branches off into the most northerly parts of the county shortly after Habrough. Just beyond Ulceby, with its 15th century church tower, a freight line branches off through Killingholme to serve the docks at Immingham while our train continues due north to Thornton Abbey which has its own station and on to Goxhill where the church tower boasts 8 pinnacles before the train slows to allow the driver to collect a single line token from the signalman at the Oxmarsh Crossing and we enter the station at New Holland – alas not the 'sumptuous railway station' as noted in Henry Thorold's Shell Guide and from which you would have accessed the pier for the paddle steamer to Hull [though if memory serves me right you can still enjoy a drink on the 'Tattershall Castle' moored on the north bank of the Thames on the Victoria Embankment at Whitehall when next you are in London]

Today's station is a simple platform and bus shelter after which the train turns abruptly left leaving behind the Humber Bulk Terminal to continue alongside the Humber through Barrow Haven with views ahead of the Humber Bridge before coming to rest in the station at Barton on Humber which has two magnificent and ancient churches: the former parish church of St Peter's is now in the care of English Heritage while the 14th century St Mary's with its 'noble clerestory' is today's working parish church

The train returned the way it had come and continued through the dock area at Grimsby to its final destination of Cleethorpes – a town developed as a holiday resort by the Manchester, Sheffield and Lincolnshire railway company. The parish church of St Peter [1866-67] is to be found on St Peter's Avenue while the gardens giving views over the pier and the Humber Estuary provided an excellent place for a leisurely lunch. No trip to the seaside would be complete without an ice cream which was indeed purchased and enjoyed before the return train to Grimsby where there was a little wait before the single carriage train would depart from platform 3 for the journey to Newark's North Gate station

After Barnetby le Wold the train took the branch heading south and west in the direction of Market Rasen. From the left-hand carriage window, the Wolds could be seen clearly with Caistor spread out on the hillside and the church at Walesby also very clear. The line enters Market Rasen with views across to its parish church with its 'embattled and pinnacled tower' and a station maintained by friends with wall paintings and flower troughs as evidence of their care and dedication.

Barkston and Syston Parish Council

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on 8th July. Eight members of the Parish Council were present, together with Councillors Ian Stokes (District Council) and Ray Wootten (County Council). Parish Councillor Alan Rowell sent apologies, as did District Councillor Mrs Rosemary Kaberry-Brown.

No reply had been received in regard to highways related issues which had been previously raised and the Clerk was asked to remind the Area Surveyor.

Several recent incidents of vehicles parking on the Village Green, most likely to visit The Stag, were reported. After discussion, it was agreed to note and monitor the situation and reconsider at the next meeting.

It was noted that despite recent heavy periods of rain, the flooding near The Stag had not re-occurred. Several matters in Syston were reported, firstly the overgrown footpath from The Drift to Main Street; secondly the uneven and broken state of Church Lane, coupled with the slippery footpath (overgrown with moss) and lastly a pothole in The Drift – for passing to the Area Surveyor for action.

A letter had been received from a local resident expressing concern about speeding on the A607 through Barkston. Contact had been made with the Lincs. Road Safety Partnership (LRSP) and a series of enforcement sessions had been programmed for July. The Council considered a request for the reconsideration of a previous decision not to consider starting a Community Speedwatch Programme (CSWP) locally. Such schemes operated in nearby Parishes – Long Bennington and Ancaster, and the Clerk was asked to write asking for feedback on the operation of the scheme, prior to reconsideration at the next meeting.

Consideration was also given to the purchase of a mobile sign, available from the LRSP, along with reminder signs which could be fixed along the route of the speed limit. Also considered was a request for the County Council to reintroduce 'rumble strips' and 'Please drive carefully through our village' signs for each end of the village. It was also agreed to request the local police to attend the next meeting to help in the further discussions.

Nothing had been heard from the County Council in regard to the legal status of the picnic area, although the LCC had confirmed that the land was now registered with the Land Registry.

The next meeting is on MONDAY 9th SEPTEMBER 2019 at 7.45 pm at the VILLAGE HALL.
