South Cliff Villages Group NOT FROM THE RECTORY



Those of you familiar with the configuration of Grantham's railway station will perhaps not be surprised that a departure from and return to the humble platform 3 would have enabled the present writer to see 'Treasure beyond Measure '

The destination was Skegness which of course involves a journey on the line east-west through the South Cliff benefice and then as the train travelled east from Sleaford we reached that part of the county which people from outside consider is typical of the entire county of Lincolnshire – the flat land of the Fen and the Marsh.

In reality that very same view over the flat lands – as you look to your left on the outward journey – reveals the delights of the Wolds with, on this particular day, the sun shining down on West Keal church with its Perpendicular tower

From the carriage window we had glimpsed what has been described as the 'largest and most impressive parish church in England' - St Botolph's church which dominates both the town and the surrounding countryside

Today Boston is 'merely' near the end of the branch line from Grantham and Sleaford to Skegness but in 1848 it was the southern point of the East Lincolnshire line from Grimsby: Henry Thorold speaks of this line 'as perhaps the most delightful of all the Lincolnshire railways - vintage Lincolnshire, rising as it were on the Humber bank, passing Wold and Marsh and traversing Fen, saluting Louth, Alford and Boston' [Lincolnshire by Henry Thorold 1996].

Today the train travels what remains of this line making an abrupt right hand turn at what was once the site of Firsby junction to enter Wainfleet [its railway station being its 'lifeline to the outside world' in the words of Henry Thorold] and so reaching the day's destination of Skegness and our onward walk over the sandlings to the nature reserve of Gibraltar Point - one bird black, one bird white, two butterflies white and a dragonfly being our tally of wild life - in time for lunch at the new visitor facility.

And here it was in a basket of books for which a small donation was invited that I came across it – 'Treasure without Measure' published by the Lincolnshire Old Churches Trust in 1981 and with a postscript by Henry Thorold in which he celebrates the county of Lincolnshire and especially its churches of which there are more than 600 with spires which point to Heaven and with towers which speak of faith in God!

We returned along the road through the more exclusive parts of the town in time for the train home which would stop at such remote places as Havenhouse and Thorpe Culvert presumably to allow boys and girls attending Skegness Grammar School to arrive home in time for tea.

In fairness not all Lincolnshire church treasures are treasures beyond measure: the 1931 one penny coin of George V which was the only significant find when the trench for the cable was dug in Hough churchyard looks to fetch a mere £16.90!

BARKSTON AND SYSTON PARISH COUNCIL

A meeting of the Parish Council was held on 10th September. Eight members of the Parish Council were present, together with District Councillor Rosemary Kaberry-Brown and County Councillor Ray Wootten. Councillors Sue Evans (Parish Council) and Ian Stokes (SKDC) sent apologies.

Many highways matters were discussed, and the Clerk updated the Council on progress with matters which had been referred. Potholes which had been referred by the Council or members of the public had been batched together and would shortly be dealt with. In regard to the proposed 50 mph speed limit between Manthorpe and Barkston, the County Council had agreed that the proposal met their criteria, and had advertised the proposal, with a closing date for comments of the 14th October. The Parish Council had no objection to these proposals, but had additionally asked that consideration be given to modifications to the white lining and ghost islands in the interests of road safety.

The "Village Gateway" scheme was again considered, and the Clerk gave details of likely costs of the actual gateways. In addition, the costs of installation had not been quantified, but the Clerk advised that these would be available for consideration at the budget meeting in January 2019.

In regard to the picnic area, the Council were reminded that one quotation had been received. A further quotation was reported to the meeting and another was awaited. The County Council had confirmed that they were not able to carry out the work themselves, and were not able to comment on the specification. Consideration was deferred to the budget meeting in January 2019.

In regard to the refurbishment of the Bier Shelter in the Burial Ground, a formal quotation for the work had not yet been received. It was agreed to defer further consideration to the budget meeting in January 2019, unless the detailed inspection and quotation revealed a need to take more urgent action.

The Council were advised that the local LIVES Group was, regrettably, now closed. The Chairman and Clerk said that they had both thanked Chris and Cora Townson for their efforts over the years.

The next meeting is on MONDAY 12th NOVEMBER 2018 at 7.45 pm at the VILLAGE HALL.

And they are good words as we remember this month the ending of the Great War, the world's first example of what became known as 'total war'. 'It'll all be over by Christmas' the British Army were told -1,568 days later, 888,246 British lives were lost. Nine to 15 million lives lost in total. Sixty-five million men from 30 countries involved. The 'war to end all wars' was what was hoped for then.

As Christians we know that ultimately the challenge of peace is not one of political solutions, important as they may be, but one of dealing with the human heart.

That is actually what the passage in Micah looks forward to. A time when all men and women look to the '*mountain of the Lord, the house of the God of Jacob*' and have their hearts and minds transformed by him, which then brings in that universal peace, which we all long to live in.

That's the ultimate vision, the ultimate hope – but until then, being peacekeepers, peacemakers in the different places we find ourselves in is something each of us is called to do, and something our world still desperately needs.
