I have been reflecting on my love of train journeys for an after dinner speech I was called on to give at the [SKDC's] Chairman's annual dinner. There is a further railway journey which we can take and which takes us in a symbolic way through the journey Christ took through the desert during the season of Lent before emerging in the light of Easter Day to the resurrection life.

Some who read this will be familiar with the geography of the Peak District or have perhaps caught the Norwich to Liverpool service from Grantham and will recognise the journey I am reconstructing and it is one which, when you know it, you can follow in your mind's eye.

If you are catching the train from Grantham take care to travel facing the rear of the train as it changes direction in Sheffield and you will leave the city of steel facing forwards; the train will now branch away from the London line at Dore station and you will enter the darkness of the Totley Tunnel while those who might be walking this route will be encountering the bleak and boggy moorland of Totley Moss. The tunnel built in 1893 runs for some 3.5 miles and the walker has the same distance to cover across Totley Moss above.

However emerging from the tunnel at Grindleford station the train races west along the appropriately named Hope Valley up which the walker can gaze as he or she sits atop the rocks of Surprise View and takes in not only the distant peaks of Win Hill and Lose Hill but also the Mam Tor ridge beyond.

For both the walker and the traveller by rail the journey takes you from the bleakness and the darkness of Holy Week and Christ's suffering into the 'broad sunlit uplands' of His Resurrection life lived out in the Hope valley through which we make our pilgrim way.

Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia

BARKSTON AND SYSTON PARISH COUNCIL

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday 12th March. Seven members of the Parish Council were present, together with District Councillor Mrs Kaberry Brown and County Councillor Wootten. Parish Councillors Elnor and Kelly submitted apologies.

Councillor Wootten commented in regard to the Parish Council's decision to take no further action in regard to the Community Speedwatch scheme, and reminded members that this decision would not prevent any other interested individuals from organising a group to run a scheme.

Many highways matters were discussed, and the Council received an update from the Area Surveyor in relation to matters which had been referred.

The Area Surveyor had advised that there was no scope to carry out improvements to the areas in Church Street which had either been badly surfaced or which had been missed, any earlier than July/August. It was suggested that the potholes should be filled prior to any resurfacing works. Councillor Jackson raised the issue of debris washed down Minnetts Hill, and a local resident had written about grit and other debris in Church Street/St Nicholas Close, and the Clerk was to request the road sweeper to clear this as soon as possible.

A local resident had contacted the Council expressing concern at the deteriorating state of the road edges on the road side by the War Memorial, mainly caused by parent parking close to the banked area. This was wearing the road edges away, as could be seen, with potential for the bank to become unstable. Clerk to repeat the previous requests for double yellow lines and bollards to prevent parking.

The verges on Main Street, Syston, were still being clipped by vehicles resulting in a wide mud slick on the inside of the bend opposite The Drift. This was being washed down towards The Drift and River Lane, with the potential for blocking drains, and causing localised flooding, and this was to be referred to the Area Surveyor.

Liaison had taken place with Belton and Manthorpe Parish Council,
