BARKSTON AND SYSTON PARISH COUNCIL

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday 6th November. Eight members of the Parish Council were present, together with District Councillor Stokes and County Councillor Wootten. Parish Councillor Tony Hine submitted apologies. No members of the public attended.

Many highways matters were discussed, and the Council received an update from the Area Surveyor in relation to matters which had been referred.

The fly tipping reported on Frinkley Lane which it was thought had been collected had still not been completely cleared as at the Thursday prior to the meeting. The Clerk said that SKDC had been reminded and collection should have taken place earlier that day.

A further request had been made for a speed survey, but no response had been received. Councillor Wootten drew attention to the Community Speedwatch Scheme, which was a scheme designed to help parishes take action themselves. It was agreed that the Clerk would circulate information to members prior to consideration at the next meeting.

Nothing had been done to repair the areas in Church Street which had been badly surfaced or which had been missed, and the Clerk was asked to remind the County Council.

The Council agreed to support Belton and Manthorpe Parish Council in their efforts to reduce the limit on the A607 to 50 mph from just north of Manthorpe up to Barkston.

The Clerk gave an update on planning applications which had been received, including a further application for development within the garden of Maple Grove, Syston, on a site which had been refused and dismissed on appeal earlier in the year. This latter application had been refused by the District Council.

In regard to the picnic area, the Clerk advised that the application for registration had been made to the Land Registry, after the search of
