NOT FROM THE RECTORY



When this issue of *In Touch* comes out, we will be well into Eastertide. Unlike the world in general, where Easter ends when the Bank Holiday ends, in our churches we carry on celebrating Easter right up until Ascension Day on May 25, and the Feast of Pentecost, which comes ten days later in June. During these six weeks, we rejoice in the fact that we are an 'Easter people', with a story to proclaim that our world badly needs to hear – the story of Christ's triumph over death and evil, and his abiding presence with us, helping us through any dark and difficult times we have to face now. Despite all the worrying things that are happening in our world, the Easter message is one of unqualified hope and joy.

'Do not be afraid' and 'Shalom' (peace be with you) are phrases that are frequently on Jesus' lips in the Gospels – he uses them particularly to reassure his disciples when he appears to them after his resurrection. And they are not just words – courage, peace and joy are qualities he imparts. His original disciples were so galvanised by the encounters they had with him during those few weeks, that afterwards they were prepared to sacrifice even their lives to tell the world all about it.

We will be hearing more about these mysterious meetings between Jesus and his disciples at our Eastertide services. They all have a rather strange, supernatural quality, but the gospels writers leave us in no doubt that he really was physically present - on one occasion even eating a piece of grilled fish to convince his terrified followers that he wasn't a ghost. The effect of those encounters on the disciples was electrifying, transforming them from a bunch of frightened and demoralised men and women into a movement that changed the world forever

The world they faced was much more dangerous and hostile than our world is today. But they were so convinced they had met with the risen Jesus and that his spirit remained with them, empowering and guiding them, that nothing could silence them. In the centuries since then, countless millions of others have had similar, life-transforming experiences of Jesus' power and presence.

The Christian story, of which we are a part, has always been a story of ordinary men and women witnessing both in words and in the way they live their lives, that Jesus is alive and is among us. Which is why – despite all the things we see when we switch on the news - we can celebrate these six weeks with confidence, joy and hope.

BARKSTON AND SYSTON PARISH COUNCIL

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday 13th March 2017. All members of the Parish Council were present, together with District Councillor Ian Stokes and County Councillor Ray Wootten.

One member of the public attended, and raised issues relating to the footpath along the A607 and opposite the Village Hall, which he considered was dangerous owing to the fact that it was narrow, due to grass overgrowth. He asked that the Parish Council request that this be cleared, together with the area at the end of the path opposite the turn to Syston. Trees growing in the verge at this point also restricted safe and proper vision southwards, and asked that this be looked into in the interests of road safety. He thanked the Playing Field Committee for the refurbishments and new play equipment provided, and asked if efforts could be made to reinstate the phone box on the A607 to working order. It was pointed out that no objection had been raised to the box's removal on grounds that it had not been used for twelve months or more.

Many highways matters were discussed, and the Council received an update from the Area Surveyor in relation to matters which had been referred.

A speed survey had been undertaken, from which it was noted that more than 58,000 vehicles had passed through Barkston both ways during the week of the survey, of which about 25% were exceeding the speed limit in varying degrees. Police speed checks had recently been carried out.

Marston Parish Council had reported on a litter collection exercise up to their parish boundary on Station Road, and suggested that Barkston and Syston might carry on with this further down the road, where there was a lot of litter. After discussion it was agreed to request action from the County Council in regard to the litter and overgrown verges.

The Clerk reported on investigations into the ownership of the picnic area, which had not yet been resolved. As soon as this had been done, acquisition would proceed as already authorised.
