NOT FROM THE RECTORY



There's a rather sad little story about a man who longed for God to make himself known to him. He prayed and prayed that God would communicate with him in some way. He decided to seek out some quiet, solitary spot, where such a spiritual encounter would be more likely to take place, and so every morning for a week he walked out to a headland overlooking the sea, where he prayed and waited. He watched the day break, the sky become awash with colour, the sea below blaze with the light of the rising sun; he heard the birds begin to sing, smelt the dawn freshness and felt the warmth on his face, and then he walked home grieving deeply, saying 'God, why do you not make yourself known to me?'

I know that many of us – unlike the man in the story - sense God's presence particularly strongly when we are out and about in the natural environment. A little while ago I was at a housegroup meeting where people were talking about where and when they felt closest to God. It was striking how many said that it was when they were out in the countryside, enjoying the peace and beauty. In fact, that came out on top, just ahead of being in church and being in the garden.

I think Jesus would rather like that. He so often told people to open their eyes and their hearts properly to God's presence – to see that the Kingdom of Heaven is not some remote, other-worldly place, but is among us and all around us: is wherever God makes himself known to us.

At this time of year, when many of us are on holiday, we have more opportunity than usual to enjoy and appreciate the world around us. A few days ago I happened to go into one of our churches in the middle of the week. I expected it to be empty, but found a lone visitor sitting quietly in one of the pews. She said she had been walking the Viking Way, and seeing the church, had turned aside on the off-chance of finding it open. 'I'm so glad I did,' she said. 'I'm not much of a church-goer, but there's such a sense of peace here – of a special presence'.

The poet R S Thomas once said that we discover what is of true value, not by hurrying on, but by pausing and turning aside, as that visiting walker had done. Whatever you are doing this holiday season, whether you are going away or staying at home, may you too find time to turn aside and enjoy the peace and the presence of God.

Barkston and Syston Parish Council

The Annual Parish Meeting was held on 9th May 2016, before the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council. Apart from the Parish Councillors, two members of the public attended. A question was asked about the proposed waiting restrictions on Church Street, and the meeting was advised that the consultation would commence shortly, when anyone affected could make comment. In reply to a query as to why the restrictions were necessary, the Chairman said that considerations of road safety were the prime reason, factors being heavy parking taking place on the bend on a narrow stretch of road, on a bus route and in front of the school.

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council followed the Annual Parish Meeting. All members of the Parish Council were present, together with County Councillor Ray Wootten. No members of the public attended.

Councillor Maryan Nussey was re-elected Chairman, and Councillor Alan Card was re-elected Vice-Chairman for the ensuing year.

The Council were advised that the consultation on the proposed waiting restrictions in Church Street, Barkston would commence shortly.

Comments had been received from the Area Surveyor about the other highways issues raised. Most of the issues raised were in the process of being investigated prior to action, and the Parish Council would be kept informed. The Area Surveyor hoped that the introduction of waiting restrictions should remove the issue of damage/erosion to the bank by the War Memorial, but in the interim he was arranging for marker posts to be installed to protect the area.

A pothole order was pending for Church Street/Honington Road, and a major patching scheme would be arranged for later this financial year with a surface dressing programme next year.

The drainage improvements outside The Stag were subject to a major scheme, for implementation this financial year. The scheme would involve installing more gullies, large diameter pipes and simplifying the flow of water to the outfall.

MINUTES: The Minutes of the Parish Council held on 11th February, 2016 were read, approved by all and signed by the Chairman and Clerk as a true record of that meeting.

MATTERS ARISING

Pot Holes in Belton Village have been repaired. The large pot hole at the edge of Five Gates Road is scheduled to be repaired during road maintenance in the area by LCC Highways.

Speed Camera: Cllr Miller is looking after the Camera and will relocate it around the two villages.

Allison Homes: County Cllr Wootten is still delivering letters and flyers and putting articles in the Journal explaining the situation and asking for support to object to the Planning Application. Residents are asked to come forward to speak against the application when it goes before the SKDC. The consultation period on the application is ongoing and the application will probably not be considered until later this year.

Gritting in Belton: The Council would like to thank Michael Coney and Tony Hopwell for all their efforts and hard work in trying to get Belton Village put on the Gritting Route by LCC Highways and Michael Coney for volunteering to store materials and grit Main Street, Belton should it be necessary during bad weather.

PLANNING APPLICATIONS: Clerk reported that the Planning Applications received since the last meeting were as follows:

S16/0402 – National Trust – Installation of lead liner to fountain. – No objections

S16/0240 – Belton Garden Centre – Erection of Storage Building – No objections.
