

NOT FROM THE RECTORY



It sounded innocuous enough. 'Would you come and talk to the children about heaven?' asked the RE teacher. It was only later, when I sat down to think what I would actually say at the school assembly, that the enormity of the task hit me. The assembly would last about twenty minutes, and 'Heaven' (aka Life After Death) is a subject that could fill whole theological libraries.

In the event, there was nothing to worry about. These were lively four to eleven-year-olds at one of our local C of E schools, and lots of hands had shot up before I'd even got to the end of my opening question: 'What do you think we mean by heaven?' The answer: 'It's where we go to be with Jesus when we die'. What followed was a discussion that put a lot of adult talk about life after death in the shade and showed how children often have a natural understanding of things that we grown-ups struggle with. It certainly made me ponder some of these big questions afresh, and I'd like to share some of the children's thoughts with you.

Given that nobody actually *knows* what heaven is like – as one child helpfully pointed out, you can't just go for a visit – we tried *imagining* what it might be like. There was talk of clouds, angels, light and brightness. Mostly though, we thought it was beyond anything we could picture but was a place where we would be happy and safe and loved forever. Even more abstract concepts to do with souls and spirits and how we leave our physical bodies behind when we die, were discussed. One youngster thought our physical body would be replaced by a spiritual body, and he described it in a way that was not far removed from the way St Paul talks about the same thing in one of his letters, only much simpler (*see 1 Corinthians* 15:35-55).

We talked about why we believe in heaven. One reason was that because God loves us, he wouldn't let our earthly life be all there is, particularly when some people have such a short, sad time on earth. Another reason was that Jesus often talked about heaven, and he should know.

We just touched on the question of who gets to go to heaven and who doesn't, but thought God wouldn't turn away anyone who really wants to be with Him, and there was one thing everyone seemed quite sure about - heaven wouldn't be heaven without animals.

Whatever you believe about these things, I hope you agree that children can be wonderfully wise and disarmingly unselfconscious in the way they talk about them, and can help us see them with fresh eyes. I felt privileged to be part of that assembly, and there's going to be a sequel. Right at the end, when we'd run out of time, one little girl put up her hand and asked: 'If you don't go to heaven, do you go to hell?' 'I think', said the teacher firmly, 'that we'll have to leave that question for another day'. It should be an interesting session; I'm looking forward to it. Watch this space!

PS Another thing we all agreed about: Heaven sounds great, but we're not in a hurry to get there.

Dear Friends.

Many of us will have experienced moments of awful isolation in our lives, or of panic, or of sheer joy. The range of situations, and of emotions, to which we can be exposed is huge. These things help to form the richness of human living. But in themselves they can sometimes be immensely difficult to handle.

Jesus' promise was to be with his friends. Although they experienced the crushing sadness of his death, and the huge sense of betrayal that most of them felt in terms of their own abandonment of him, they also experienced the joy of his resurrection and the happiness of new times spent with him. They would naturally have understood that his promise to 'be with them' meant that he would not physically leave them. However, what Jesus meant when he said that they would not be left on their own was that the Holy Spirit would always be with them. It is the Spirit, the third Person of the Holy Trinity, that we celebrate during the month of May. Jesus is taken from us, body and all, but the Holy Spirit is poured out for us and on to us.

The Feast of the Holy Spirit is Pentecost. It happens at the end of Eastertide, and thus marks the very last transition that began weeks before when, on Ash Wednesday, we entered the wilderness in preparation for Holy Week and Eastertide to come. Coming 'at the end of things' Pentecost can sometimes seem to be almost an afterthought – a last gasp of celebration before the year turns fully green and 'normal time' resumes. I suggest that we should, however, try to see it as another moment of real transition, when, gifted with the Holy Spirit, God's people realise that they have all that they need in order to live their lives fully and without fear in the world.

The Holy Spirit is described in scripture as 'advocate' and 'guide'. He is the Person of the Trinity who is always there. No matter what our particular emotions may be in any moment, God is with us.

As we continue to grapple with population movement, with continuing unrest in so many parts of the world, and with the serious issue of the Referendum in our own country, to name but three things, I hope that we may draw strength, confidence and joy from the presence of the Spirit. Our gracious God does equip us with all that we need to live our lives as disciples in the world today.

May God bless you this Pentecost and always, Bishop Nicholas

Barkston and Syston Parish Council

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday 14th March 2016. All members of the Parish Council were present, together with District Councillors Rosemary Kaberry-Brown and Ian Stokes, and County Councillor Ray Wootten. No members of the public attended.

The meeting started with a short question and answer session about Neighbourhood Plans. Present to assist the Council was the Clerk of Foston Parish Council, who were part way through the process. Three Members and the Clerk were to attend a Community Lincs seminar on the subject on Thursday, and it was therefore agreed to defer a final decision to the next meeting to give these Members the opportunity to report back.

The Council were advised that the County Council still did not have a start date for the consultation on the proposed waiting restrictions in Church Street, Barkston.

Comments had been received from the Area Surveyor about the other highways issues raised. Most of the issues raised were in the process of being investigated prior to action, and the Parish Council would be kept informed. Action was proposed which it was hoped would restrict damage/erosion to the bank by the War Memorial

The Syston Village sign had now been replaced. No action had been taken in regard to the trees at the side of the A607 between the two entrances to Syston, and the Clerk was asked to remind the Area Surveyor. Hopefully, work on patching and surface dressing Church Street/Honington Road would start shortly.

One of the drains in the A607 near The Stag was blocked, and the Area Surveyor was to be asked to arrange for cleaning out/jetting of all drains in the area. It was hoped that the drainage improvements could start in the next financial year.

Damage to Station Road in the form of very large potholes and broken road edges were reported and the Clerk was asked to refer this to the Area Surveyor. Also severely damaged was the road from the end of West Street to Barkston Gorse. This had been repaired with road
