

**NOT FROM THE RECTORY**



Dear friends,

When this issue of ‘In Touch’ comes out, we will already be half way through Lent. I have to admit that Lent really caught me on the hop this year - it seemed to come so early. We had no sooner celebrated Candlemass, which traditionally marks the end of the Christmas season, before it was Ash Wednesday, and we were into the more sombre season of Lent. For centuries, these six weeks have been observed as a time of self-denial and self-examination for Christians – a time when we try to live in a better way, or, as someone put it when we were discussing the purpose of Lent at our Family Service at Barkston, ‘It’s about giving ourselves an inner Spring clean – really bottoming it’.

These days, of course, Lent is not observed nearly as widely or as strictly as in the past, and I think the emphasis has changed too. It used to be all about giving things up, and many people did commit to living in a much more disciplined and austere way, often abstaining from meat and rich foods for the whole six weeks. And it didn’t stop there. I remember as a child how even innocent pleasures could be frowned upon by the especially Godfearing – Lent was not supposed to be a time for *enjoying* yourself..

But being a killjoy is not what Lent was originally all about. It was a time of prayer and abstinence, certainly, but we were not meant to be miserable about it. The 40 days of Lent remind us of the 40 days Jesus spent in prayer and fasting in the wilderness in preparation for the great mission God had entrusted to him. In the same way, for us, practising some form of self-denial was never meant to be an end in itself but a way of helping us engage more deeply with our faith, and particularly with Jesus as he journeyed through his Passion and death to the glory of his resurrection.

Which is why many Christians these days like the idea of taking something on for Lent as an alternative to giving something up, believing it's better to do something to benefit others rather than make a token gesture of renouncing say chocolate or alcohol for a little while – something which may well have more to do with our health and waistlines than with spiritual growth.

The word Lent itself comes from an old English word meaning Spring, so making some sort of special effort to renew of our faith during these few weeks mirrors the renewal of the natural world we see going on all around us. The end result is, or should be, a heightened sense of joy and celebration when we come at last to Easter, the great 'Feast of Feasts' of the Christian year. So that comment about giving ourselves a good Spring clean – really 'bottoming it' -was spot on.

Wishing you happy cleaning (it's not too late to start) and a truly joyous Easter.

The Council were advised that the County Council did not yet have a start date for the consultation on the proposed waiting restrictions in Church Street, Barkston, as the proposal was essentially starting again, following previous objections.

A check on the grit bins had been carried out and the County Council had been advised that the four bins were in a good condition and were

And they have been passed on to LCC Highways.

full of salt/grit mix.

It was agreed that, pending permanent kerbing and improvements to the road on the Church/War Memorial corner, to request the Area Surveyor to carry out temporary repairs to the road edging, possibly by stone haunching. The Syston Village sign had fallen down and a request was to be made for its replacement. A request was also to be made for attention to be given to the trees at the side of the A607 between the two entrances to Syston, several large branches from which had fallen in recent high winds.

An update was given on various planning applications. The Clerk reminded Members that he had circulated details of several applications at the Mid-Uk recycling site on the High Dyke near Ancaster. The Parish Council had been consulted as a neighbouring authority. Comments had been received in relation to the adverse likely impact which would be caused by increased traffic to the site, the likelihood of Station Road being used as a 'rat run', and the potential fire risk. These comments had been sent to the County Council.

Councillor Kelly reported that the new play equipment had been installed, although the suppliers still had to fix one or two minor issues. The area was currently closed in view of bad weather, and also to allow the grass to grow. Benches would be installed, possibly next month. It was intended to organise an official opening, which would be supported by the suppliers.

Councillor Alan Card was appointed to fill a vacancy as a Trustee of the Barkston Educational Foundation.

A consultation on the Electoral Review of Lincolnshire had been circulated for Members to decide what comments, if any, to make. A discussion took place and it was suggested that the proposed name for the Division, namely Ancaster and Manthorpe, did not accurately reflect its location. It was suggested that Grantham North Rural might be more appropriate, and this was agreed.

The Parish Council considered a report on the proposed budget for 2016/2017. A revised quotation for grass cutting was agreed, and a quotation for a possible bus shelter in Syston, was noted. Funding for

expenditure on the proposed Neighbourhood Plan, if it was eventually decided to proceed, had been included in the sum of £1,000; a defibrillator for Syston - £2,500; levelling of plots in the Burial Ground - £500; Syston bus shelter (if eventually provided) – £1,200. In regard to the Syston bus shelter, it was agreed to defer a final decision to the next meeting, pending investigation with local residents into the likely need.

The total proposed budget was in the sum of £14,185. If left as proposed, there would be a small increase in the Band D charge. However, if the budget was reduced by £299 to £13,886 the Band D charge would remain the same as for 2015/2016, i.e. £55.53. The Parish Council agreed to this suggestion and the precept for 2016/2017 will be £13,886.

The next meeting is on MONDAY 14<sup>th</sup> MARCH 2016 at 7.45 pm in the VILLAGE HALL.

### **BELTON AND MANTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING**

Summary Minutes of the Meeting held at the Village Hall, Belton on Thursday 11th February 2016

Attending: Chairman Councillor K.Gibson, Councillors T. Hopwell, R. Gibson, C. Thornton, J. Miller, S Thompson, E. Bannister, County Cllr R. Wootten, J. Fountain Parish Clerk

#### **1. Matters pertaining to Belton were as follows:-**

**2. Smoke Pollution in Belton:** Cllr. Hopwell met with Alec Gordon at National Trust Liaison meeting and he confirmed that there will be no more bonfires for the foreseeable future.

**3. Speed Limits – A607 - Belton:** The new Policy on speeds limits has now been published. The Councillors will look at the policy and find out what the position is on limits for the A607. The Council will apply for a reduced limit on the stretch of the A607 from Manthorpe, Belton through to Syston. Cllr Wootten to forward Policy to Clerk.

**4. The Yew tree at Belton:** LCC Highways has cut back the over growth on the path out of Belton across towards Belton Woods Hotel but has not yet cut back the Yew tree.

Clerk to write and remind LCC Highways of the situation.

**5. SPEED CAMERA:** The camera has been in Manthorpe since the end of November. Cllr Miller to turn the camera to the other direction for a time. Belton to receive the camera in due course.

**6. HIGH SPEED BROADBAND BELTON:** High speed broadband is now up and running in Belton.

#### **7. SMALLER AUTHORITIES AUDIT APPOINTMENTS:**

The Council has decided that it will still opt in to the new scheme and pay the £100 for 5 years which covers the cost of providing an external auditor should one be required.

**8. ALLISON HOMES:** The Parish Council has submitted a letter of objection to SKDC reference the Planning Application from Allison Homes. County Cllr Wootten has delivered 1,600 letters by hand to local areas explaining the situation and asking for support to object to the Planning Application. He has also asked, through an article in the Journal, for local drivers to keep a log for two weeks keeping track of the time spent in traffic in the mornings on the A607 to highlight traffic problems that already exist. The consultation period on the application is ongoing and the application will probably not be considered until July.

**LETTER FROM THE BISHOP**

**We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.  
Though we are many, we are one body,  
because we all share in one bread.**

Familiar words from the Communion Service which many of us use every week – but words which also came alive for me in a fresh way on two particular occasions over the past year.

The first was at the 'Shared Conversations' – those regional gatherings of people from across the East Midlands, including some from our own diocese, gathering for three days to explore some of the current issues regarding human sexuality and how we handle together the different views and feelings that issue evokes. To be able to be part of a group of people, who, despite our differences on that particular issue, met around the communion table, were able to break bread together and so recognise the Jesus in each other, was, for me, an incredibly moving and profound experience.

The second, and more recent, occasion was sharing ten days with almost thirty other relatively recently new bishops from across the different countries of the Anglican Communion, and again that real sense as we took communion together of being united because of our common faith and trust in Jesus, despite all the different cultural and theological understandings contained in the room.

An experience of the Risen Jesus which then unites across time, place and some of the theological differences we may have with each other. That, it seems to me, is at least part of what is happening as we take communion, as we break bread, together. It is one of God's gifts to his Church.

I pray, says Jesus, that they be 'one'. Not the same, not identical, but 'one'. Able to recognise, rejoice and celebrate the reality of the Risen Jesus in each other, despite our differences, as we share in bread together. That's been my experience, on those two special occasions. I pray that it might be yours as well.
