NOT FROM THE RECTORY

Dear Friends

One of my favourite photographs in our family album is of our daughter on the day she started school. She's in her new uniform, hair uncharacteristically tidy, and the inevitable sticking plaster across one knee. I can still recall that catch of the heart when I saw her dressed for school for the first time. Her no-nonsense headmistress, who was at the school door to greet new arrivals and shoo away their mums said: 'When you get home you'll either breathe a huge sigh of relief or you'll have a howl'. I was a howler.

September is a time of similar new beginnings for many of our children – and for their parents. Some are taking that first big step of starting school. Others are facing the leap from primary to secondary school, or from school to college, university or the workplace. It's a time of great change, and like all change, can be both alarming and exciting. Whenever we have to step out into the unknown we do so with a conflicting mix of emotions. This stepping out into the unknown goes on right through our lives – when we move house or move job, for instance, or when we have to begin life on our own after the loss of a partner or the breakdown of a marriage. And it doesn't get any easier as the years go by. One of the most daunting experiences can come when we're elderly and have to 'downsize' from the home we have lived in for many years, perhaps to move into sheltered accommodation or residential care.

Sometimes we can be in danger of badly missing out on life because we lack the courage to leave what is familiar and safe. A recurrent phrase in the Bible is: 'Do not be afraid. I am with you.' The whole story of the Christian faith is of people stepping out into the unknown in answer to God's call, and when they do so, discovering that wherever they go, he journeys with them.

In the Old Testament God is often pictured as being like a parent bird – an eagle – whose sheltering wings are never far away. It was thought that when the time came for a young eaglet to fly, it was encouraged to leave the nest by the call of the parent. The great bird would fly past calling it to come to the edge – an anxious moment for a young bird which had never tested its wings before. At last it would take off, but the parent was never far away, ready to swoop down beneath the young bird and bear it up if needed.

This month, as the new academic year begins, please remember our children and young people in your prayers. Remember too their parents, and the teachers and other staff who will support them as they spread their wings and learn to cope with new and challenging situations. May God give us all the courage to step out into the unknown when we need to.

BARKSTON AND SYSTON PARISH COUNCIL

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday 13th July 2015. All members of the Parish Council were present, together with District Councillors Ian Stokes and Rosemary Kaberry-Brown, and County Councillor Ray Wootten.

Prior to commencing the formal business of the meeting, the Chairman presented Bernard Noves with a small gift to mark his retirement from the Parish Council after 19 years service.

The only matter raised during the public forum was in relation to the proposed waiting restrictions on Church Street/Honington Road, which the Chairman explained would be discussed in detail later in the meeting.

It was agreed to discontinue the practice of placing full sets of draft minutes on the boards in Main Street, Syston and St Nicholas Close, Barkston, in view of the amount of space these took up on the small boards, restricting the space for other notices of local interest. A notice would be placed advising residents that the minutes were available on the Parish Council's website, the address of which is: www.parishes.Lincolnshire.gov.uk/BarkstonandSyston or by application to the Clerk.

The Council considered an email from Lincolnshire County Council containing comments which had been received following the statutory consultation for the proposed waiting restrictions. Members considered all the points made in the email and confirmed unanimously their wish to proceed with the proposals as first drafted, i.e. north side of Church Street and Honington Road from the handgate to Church Farm, round the corner to a point opposite the northern boundary of the Churchyard, and a similar line on the south side. The Clerk was requested to send a rebuttal of the comments made in the LCC email.

Comments had been received from the Area Surveyor about the other highways issues raised. Most of the issues raised were in the process of being investigated prior to action, and the Parish Council would be kept informed. A meeting to discuss prioritisation of highways issues, which had been deferred for the attendance of the Area Surveyor at a future meeting, was again deferred, as no date had been agreed. The Clerk was asked to remind the Area Surveyor. The Clerk was asked to refer potholed and uneven roads from Minnetts Hill to the Playing Field, Church Street and Station Road, Barkston to the Area Surveyor for inspection and action.

An update was given on various planning applications, and the Clerk reported that the appeal into the refusal of an application to erect a dwelling at the rear of 12 West Street, Barkston had been dismissed. The Local Plan update was in preparation, although no additional sites had been requested for Barkston and Syston.

No comments had been made on the Thackson's Well Wind Turbine application, and it was agreed to continue to support the local Parish Council. The Chairman and Councillors Elnor and Evans reported on attendance at a recent meeting in connection with policies in regard to wind turbines

Councillor Rowell advised that the dead bush in the Burial Ground had been removed by himself and Councillor Card. Both Councillors were thanked for their action. It was agreed to obtain a price for cutting the hedges.

The Playing Field constitution had been reviewed, but it was not considered that any changes were necessary. Quotations had been sought for the proposed improvements to the Children's Corner, and further discussions were being held with one firm. It was intended to carry out some work this year.

The Council further discussed the Clerk's report on risks affecting the Council. Further advice had been sought, and it was agreed to confirm the 2 monthly interval for inspection of the Children's Corner and 6 monthly interval for the remainder of the risks identified in the report. The only outstanding issue was the interval for checks on the fire equipment in the Pavilion. It was agreed to check this and amend the document accordingly.

The next meeting is on MONDAY 14th SEPTEMBER 2015 at 7.45 pm at the VILLAGE HALL.
