

Barkston and Syston Parish Council

The Parish Council met on Monday 8th September 2014. Six Members of the Parish Council were present together with four members of the public.

Before the commencement of the Parish Council meeting, Chris Townson, a member of Barkston LIVES gave a presentation on the work of the Group since it was set up in 2013. The two main objectives of the Group were to provide 24/7 coverage and to become self-sufficient. It was noted that the Group was financially stable, although always in need of money, and Chris Townson outlined proposals for increasing funding. Group membership remained the same, at 5, although it was hoped to recruit two new members within the next two months, thereby increasing the level of cover. The Chairman thanked Chris Townson for attending, and for his interesting presentation.

During the public forum, a member of the public drew attention to the continuing problems with flooding on the A607, near The Stag. The Clerk explained the current discussions with the Highway Authority, and the Council were asked to stress the importance of action soon, particularly in view of the danger to traffic and pedestrians from the deep area of water at the location.

Highways matters were discussed, and the Council received an update with regard to matters on which action had been promised.

The Council were reminded that they had agreed in principle to the erection of a bus shelter on Church Street, outside the School. Two objections had been received to an informal consultation on the grounds that the short "sides" on the proposed shelter would obstruct pedestrians, particularly those with buggies or in wheelchairs. The Clerk showed a plan of the shelter without the sides, and the Council confirmed their wish to proceed on this basis, subject to planning permission. Formal consultation would take place on the planning application in due course.

A recent case of fly tipping on Minnetts Hill had been dealt with speedily, and the Council considered a suggestion that the road be stopped up so that it could be gated, thereby preventing access for the tippers. After discussion, this suggestion was not proceeded with.

A request had been received for the reduction of the speed limit on Hough Road from 40 to 30 mph, and the Clerk was asked to forward this to the Area Surveyor for consideration.

Consideration will be given at the next meeting to the drafting of a Neighbourhood Plan for Barkston and Syston.

All this effort has been a great help as the maintenance provided by Lincs. County Council is somewhat infrequent.

Following the cleaning of the Barkston War Memorial I should like to thank Rev. Alan Littlewood for conducting such an appropriate service and also most particularly thank our Parish Clerk, Malcolm Hall, for all the research he undertook into the names from World War 1 listed on the memorial.

An amendment to the Burial Grant form was agreed, to provide for the levelling of grave mounds after 12 months, rather than the existing six, as it was not considered that the soil would have been consolidated enough within six months. The Parish Council agreed to fund the running costs of the machine, which could be sited on the outside wall of the School

BELTON AND MANTHORPE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

Minutes of the Meetings held at the Village Hall, Belton On Thursday 21st August 2014

Attending: Chairman M.Coney, Councillors J. Beaty, R. Gibson, T. Hopwell, S. Thompson, K.Gibson, D.Platts, J. Fountain Parish Clerk.

Matters pertaining to Belton were as follows:-

Belton Old School – Village Hall & Parking in Belton: Car Park still not usable but will help matters when it is. Car Parking in Main Street not quite so bad, although when the Antique Road Show was held at Belton House it was chaotic as police cones had not been deployed to stop street parking. The Chairman has been in touch with Brian Gault, LCC Highways trying to move things forward regarding the yellow lines and parking bays.

Speeding through Manthorpe & Belton. County Cllr Ray Wootten to send latest report on reactive Speed Signs and order forms to Clerk. Things are moving forward in that Parishes can actually order the signs. Will need to be discussed further.

Pot Holes in Belton & Manthorpe: Tony Hopwell had reported the pot holes in Barkston Heath Lane, Belton to "Fix My Street.com" on the internet. LCC Highways filled the pot holes, first temporarily and they have now been filled properly in the worst stretch from Belton Cottage to Carpenters cottage. The internet apparently gets their attention and should perhaps be used more in this way.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

A request had been received from Barkston Heath Parish Council asking the Belton & Manthorpe P.C. to consider supporting LIVES which aids the infirm in their homes. The Council asked for a demonstration after which it would consider offering a donation.

BONFIRES

Tony Hopwell reported that concern had been expressed over smoke pollution from bonfires in Belton, particularly during the recent hottest part of the Summer when people had their doors and windows open. A number of Belton residents have breathing difficulties and are susceptible to smoke pollution. People should ideally use alternatives such as composting, removal to the council tip or skips, for large volumes. If you must have a bonfire, only burn dry material when the wind is away from your neighbours and never leave a fire unattended to smoulder – put it out.

The next meeting will be held at Belton Village Hall on 27th November at 7.30pm. There being no further business the meeting closed at 8.45pm

St Nicholas Church in Peril

The church in Barkston as been here for over 700 years – 700 years of being 'here' for the local community. The oldest bell is inscribed 'God save the 1602 church' and that bell, along with its five fellows, is still used to day, to ring out and tell the community about local celebrations. The church is used for baptisms and marriages; it is a central meeting point for village events like the jubilee celebrations; it is a focus in times of peril; it is a place to celebrate our achievements; and at the end of life, it is the place for everyone to say farewell – all this as well as a place for worship on a Sunday. But St. Nicholas has a problem, the same problem many of us face everyday, the problem of making ends meet. It costs over £10,000 a year just to keep our church in Barkston open - £5,000 goes towards the cost of our clergy, £3,000 on insurance, another £1000 on keeping the building safe, and we all know the costs of heating and lighting!

Many of you do not want to visit the church every week, or even more than a couple of times a year – but you do want the Church to be there when it's your time – to celebrate a birth, a death or a marriage. Many people believe that the Church of England is fabulously wealthy – well it was once, a long time ago, but no longer. Local churches have to find the money to run themselves and St. Nicholas' is **our** local church and it is up to every member of the community to support it, if we want it to continue to be 'there' when we need it.

Could you spare just a few pounds once a month? If everyone supported St. Nicholas' in this way, we could be sure that our Church would always be there and ready when we, the community, need it.
