

From the Rectory

For many years the 1st of May has been known as 'International Labour Day'. It began as a celebration of the introduction of the 'eight-hour-day', a day with eight hours for work, eight for leisure and eight for sleep. As a young lad I watched 'Tomorrow's World' on T.V. and recall a programme about nuclear power stations – electricity would be generated so cheaply it would be free! Similarly, robots would lead to far more leisure time for all. The former remains a pipe-dream and where technology has resulted in greater leisure time there often isn't the income to enjoy it.

Jesus described the kingdom of heaven as being like a wealthy landowner who went early to the marketplace and hired labourers to work in his vineyard, agreeing to pay 'the usual daily wage' (this was enough to support a family). When he went out at nine o'clock, he saw others standing idle and sent them also into the vineyard, agreeing to pay them, 'What was right.' This was repeated at noon, 3pm and 5pm. When evening came, the labourers were lined up in reverse order, those who began last being paid first. Those starting at 5pm were given a full day's pay. When all had been paid the same, those who had worked since early morning and on through the heat of the day complained at not receiving more. The landowner asked why - since they had received the agreed wage: if he chose to pay the same amount to all, surely it was up to him how he spent his wealth and they had no cause for complaint?

This parable may have much to say about practise in the workplace today, particularly on the concept of a 'living wage', but it's intended to remind 'workers for the kingdom' that all such, whenever they begin, are promised the same ultimate living wage - eternal life.

Barkston and Syston Parish Council

Report for 'In Touch'

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday 10th March 2014. 8 members of the Parish Council were present. Six members of the public attended. District Councillor Trevor Scott and County Councillor Ray Wootten also attended.

The meeting commenced with the public forum, during which a member of the public drew the attention of the Council to the proposals for double yellow lines on and around the Church corner. It was suggested that as the area was within the Barkston Conservation Area, efforts should be made to ensure that signage and the lines themselves were sympathetic to the Conservation Area. Dog fouling was also raised, particularly in Church Street, but also elsewhere in the village, and the Clerk was asked to refer this to SKDC's Dog Warden. Safety in the area of the school was mentioned, particularly with the number of parents attending twice a day. This also had an effect on parking, or the lack of it, for local residents who did not have off-road parking. To be referred to the County Council with a request that consideration be given to reserved spaces for local residents, possibly via a permit system. Lastly, the Clerk was asked to refer a request for a reduction in the Hough Road speed limit from 40mph to 30mph.

Highways matters were discussed, and the Council were advised that in regard to the footpath in front of the Bedehouses, a site meeting had been arranged with the Area Surveyor, to include a discussion on the very uneven and potholed surface of Church Street and Honington Road.

The Area Surveyor had promised action on the various outstanding highway matters, referred to at the last meeting, and contractors were to be chased as appropriate. The misuse of Bridleway number 4 alongside the river to Marston was discussed, and it was agreed to continue lobbying the County Council to agree to the provision of a gate to block the route to 4WD vehicles and motorcycles. The landowner had agreed to the gate and it was agreed to price the cost of installation as well as referring to the County Council.

Western Power had replied in regard to the undergrounding of overhead cables in Syston, stating that there were no proposals to carry out such work in the next financial year.

The flooding at the garage and on Hough Road continued to be investigated, and Councillor Scott confirmed similar problems when he owned the premises. It was not apparent that the car wash was adding to the problems being experienced. A request had been received for a bus shelter on Church Street, and it was agreed to refer this to the County Council for consideration to be given to the location of the shelter and any grants available.

The Clerk reported further on changes to the Burial Grant form, in particular in regard to next of kin being responsible for the maintenance of memorials. It was apparent that it would be difficult to pursue next of kin in these circumstances and it was agreed to take no further action in regard to this suggested amendment. A scrap drive had been organised by Councillor John Jackson and Messrs A West and P Wheeler to help fund the maintenance and cleaning. The Council expressed thanks for these efforts.

In the future, any applications from the Charity or from other Parish Council funds will require backing by an indication of the applicant's financial status, and will require feedback after the grant has been made. The Clerk was asked to redesign the application form.

What is Cursillo?

Cursillo (pronounced 'kur see-yo') is a movement of the Church providing a method by which Christians are empowered to grow through prayer, study and action, and enabled to share God's love with everyone.

What our former Bishop, Bishop John, said about Cursillo.

"Cursillo is to Christian discipleship what weight-watchers is to health and well being! It creates an environment in which who we are can be celebrated, and we can be helped to become the people God would have us be. The support of others who have made the journey before us is at the heart of the Cursillo experience, and it is always encouraging to see lives changed in such a positive way. Cursillo is now well-established as a uniquely valuable way for Clergy and Lay people to refresh their relationship with God by means which are as enjoyable as they are enriching."
