

The Parish Council met at Belton Old School Village Hall, on Thursday 21st November 2013. Seven Councillors and County Councillor Ray Wooton, were present.

Matters pertaining to Belton were as follows:-

Belton Old School – Village Hall: Work is now completed. The Parish Council found the facilities in the new meeting room to be very good and is very grateful to the National Trust for allowing it to use this venue.

The Village Hall is very popular with the local community and it is used frequently for meetings and social gatherings, for flower arranging, sewing and a choir.

A condition of the approval for the change of purpose and alterations to the property was that a car park would be provided at the rear with marked spaces and spaces for the disabled. However, it has not been provided as per the plans and is muddy and uneven underfoot which is a cause for concern. M. Coney and T. Hopwell will bring this up with Alec Gordon of the National Trust.

Crime Levels in Belton: Nothing to report.

Excess Water on A607: County Councillor R.Wootton reported that he was continually asking Highways when they were going to get the grips done but although it has been approved it is of a low priority.

Parking Problem in Belton. People are still parking in the road when visiting Belton House and also when using the Village Hall. Parking is sometimes dangerous on the corner by the Forge. Michael Coney has an idea which might help but has asked that it be brought up at the next Council meeting.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

Flooding in Belton between Belton House entrance and the A607. A letter was sent from the Parish Council last year. Highways Division replied on 4th December 2012 stating they were aware of the matter. They had recently undertaken detailed investigations of the drainage system in this area and were preparing a re-build of the old drainage system. To date no action has been taken and the flooding still occurs. T. Hopwell has written to the Highways reporting this and is awaiting a reply. Councillor will speak to Highways to get an answer. Flooding at the end of Five Gates Road and Alma Road end also reported. Probably due to blocked drain. Councillor R. Wootton to ask Highways.

David Couth, PC Chairman, will be resigning in May next year. The Parish Council will need a replacement. It was suggested that the new Chairman should come from Belton.

Sally Thompson feels that the 30mph sign at the top of Belton village should be moved to where it can be seen properly. It was decided to leave it until the reactive signs are brought in.

The next Parish Meeting will be held on February 13th 2014 at the Manthorpe Village Hall.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 9.30pm.

Barkston and Syston Parish Council

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday 11th November 2013. Eight members of the Parish Council were present. Three members of the public attended.

The meeting commenced with the public forum. A member of the public raised the issue of a planning application which he had submitted for development at the rear of his house on West Street, Barkston. He outlined aspects of the application compared to an earlier application he had submitted, and which had been withdrawn, and asked the Parish Council to take these into account in considering their comments on the application to SKDC.

Highways matters were discussed, and the Council were advised that in regard to the footpath in front of the Bedehouses, exploratory boreholes were to be dug to establish the line and depth of cables, before a decision could be made on any works to improve the area.

Work to reinstate the double yellow lines at the A607 end of Church Street had still not taken place, and the Clerk was asked to remind the Area Surveyor. The order to install double yellow lines around the Church corner on Church Street/Honington Road would be processed in the next batch when the road was resurfaced. Yet more damage to the wall of Pear Tree Farm was reported, caused by HGVs which had turned off the A607 onto Church Street by mistake, and attempting to turn round the point of the Village Green had hit the wall. The County Council had been advised and the Clerk was also asked to ask local businesses if they were aware of any issues. Councillor Elnor reported that the dangerous gates protecting the railway crossing near Mill Farm had been repaired.

Flooding on The Stag corner and on Station Road was reported for referral to the County Council. Repair work to The Close had still not been done, and the Clerk was asked to report this to the Area Surveyor for action. Some overhead cables around the Church and Old Hall in Syston had been undergrounded, and the Clerk was asked to contact
