Jocelyn's Voluntary year in Honduras with Project Trust

First of all I'd like to apologise for writing so belatedly. However when I left for Honduras a new editor of the In Touch was yet to be found so I was unable to get anything published. By the time of you reading this I will have returned from my five day trip to Guatemala and Belize, a trip which was necessary in order to renew my visa for the next three months. In some ways it seems like ages since I waved goodbye to Syston; I can't remember what it feels like to be cold, to lie on a sofa or to drink a cup of Great British tea. But in other ways it feels like I've only just arrived; I now know the names of all the 39 children and 11 Honduran nannies and they too know mine.

I understand the children's individual personalities a lot better and with my Spanish improving each day I am now able to communicate much better with both the nannies and children (although my sentence structure is horrendous but I just laugh along when they laugh at me). The home, as I said, has 39 children and they are aged between 7 months and 15 years. The majority of them attend school so I spend most of my time with the 12 toddlers providing love and attention, changing nappies and creating games and activities to aid their development. There is also one severely disabled boy called Pedro that I do exercises with, the ultimate goal with Pedro is that one day he may be able to walk independently.

My Project Trust partner Jenny and I share a bedroom together and a house with the directors of the home and two other long-term volunteers. Jenny and I do our food shopping together and I have assumed the role of Chef. I cook our evening meals - we have cereal for breakfast and eat lunch with the children - which with our decision to become vegetarians due to the extortionate price of meat proved a challenge in the beginning but I am definitely getting the hang of it now!

It's safe to say that I am having the time of my life in Honduras and each day I fall in love with the people and this country even more. I would just like to (very belatedly) thank everyone that supported me in getting here, I appreciate it more than I can express in words. From those of you that gave a donation, endured the quiz night, gave a tip at the Farm Shop or

Barkston and Syston Parish Council

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday 9th September 2013. 8 members of the Parish Council were present. One member of the public attended.

The meeting commenced with the public forum. Issues in relation to the safety of the newly installed central refuge on the A607 were mentioned, and a formal complaint had been made to the County Council. The County Council had replied that the refuge had been constructed to standard. Further comments were made in relation to the number of wind turbine applications in the area

Many highways matters were discussed. The letter in regard to the footpath in front of the Bedehouses which had been prepared by Councillor Jackson and the Clerk had been sent to the MP, but no reply had been received other than an acknowledgement, and nothing had been heard from the County Council. It was agreed to give the County Council until December to reply.

Discussion took place with regard to the ongoing road works on the A607. The issue raised in regard to the use of the Village Green, which was being used as a temporary vehicle/equipment park by the contractors, had been resolved and no lasting damage had been noted. There were no issues in regard to potential damage to the river. It was expected that the reactive signs would be installed within two weeks, and the completion of the double yellow lines in the Village Green area had been noted for action. The Clerk was asked to remind the County Council of the outstanding issue regarding the installation of double yellow lines around the Church Street corner, in the interests of road safety and access. Councillor Elnor reported on dangerous gates protecting the railway crossing near Mill Farm, and on action taken to contact Network Rail for repairs.

On planning, there had been no objection to the felling of a conifer at a property in Church Street. A neighbouring authority consultation in respect of a solar farm at West Willoughby, on the northern border of the parish was also not objected to. The wind turbine at Marston was now subject to an appeal, and there had been a fresh application on a different site at Carlton Scroop on which an objection had been made.

It was agreed to accept a quotation for the cutting of the Burial Ground hedge, and replanting on the Honington Road side, where there were gaps. Brambles and vines would also be removed. The Clerk advised that the northern half of The Burial Ground was nearly at capacity and it would be necessary to start using the southern side and he requested authority to have the area surveyed and a new plan prepared.

Funding requirements for the Lives group and a possible defibrillator were discussed, and the Clerk was asked to report to the next meeting. Concern had
