



From the Rectory

A bible text for the Olympics (Hebrews ch12 v1):

'Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and **let us run with perse-verance the race marked out for us**...'

Here is a sporting metaphor for how to live life. Since the race is marked out for us and perseverance is called for, it is clearly not a quick sprint, but a marathon or cross-country event.

If you've ever set yourself the challenge of running for any great distance, you'll know there may come a point where you're tempted to stop and walk for a while. 'Do I really need to run all the way? Haven't I done enough? Who will ever know? What's the point of keeping going?' Perseverance is much more than a physical thing – it is as much to do with mental, emotional, and spiritual stamina and willpower.

What will keep us going? For Olympic Marathon runners it is finishing the race, the cheers of the crowd, perhaps the hope of a medal. For Christians the resurrection of Jesus makes our hope certain. Jesus who 'endured' the cross for the joy in front of him is our role model. ' Lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely. Carrying extra weight doesn't help – how do people run the London Marathon in those whacky costumes? The race we run as Christians is not about drawing attention to ourselves, it's about keeping on track and maintaining the momentum. Perhaps that's why Jesus told the young, rich ruler to divest himself of all his possessions by giving them to the poor? There's nothing necessarily wrong with the latest gadgets and wanting to look good in fashionable clothes, but what if they distract us from giving and living for Christ? Maybe, as we watch the sleek bodies and minimalist dress of the athletes, it can challenge us about the quality of our dedication.

The problem with extra weight is that it has become 'the sin that clings so closely.' Sin, although it is draining and detrimental, has become so much part of us that we don't notice it - until we're under pressure. It certainly doesn't assist us in the race of life. Sometimes it's really helpful to come before God and ask him the truth about our sinful selves. It can strengthen our resolve to get rid of the flab and get on with the running.

But who would know if I stopped and walked? It's my choice. Yes, but God has marked out the race and called us into his squad. And we have a huge set of supporters – the martyrs, the Christian philanthropists, pioneer missionaries... the great cloud of witnesses. When we are struggling, then we need to be aware of that great cloud for inspiration – just as athletes can be lifted by the encouragement of a home crowd. Every athlete whose eyes lock-on to the eyes of their coach - the one who has trained with them, shared their struggles, laughed with them, walked with them - feels an extra surge of power. So we run, 'looking to Jesus'! Jesus is no stained-glass image - he's alive and on the road with us.

This Olympic Games - London 2012, let's keep on running our race, whatever team GB do



Barkston and Syston Parish Council

The Annual Parish Meeting for the Parishes of Barkston and Syston was held on Monday 14th May in the Village Hall. No matters were raised, and this meeting was then followed by the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council. 8 members of the Parish Council were present, together with District Councillor Trevor Scott and County Councillor Ray Wootten for part of the meeting. Two members of the public attended.

The meeting commenced with the public forum, during which a matter was raised in connection with the scoping request for the proposed erection of 5 400 foot high wind turbines at Brandon. Although it was accepted that there would be little or no visual impact on Barkston or Syston, the member of the public asked the Parish Council to consider supporting those nearer parishes which would be more affected.

Councillor Maryan Nussey was re-elected Chairman of the Council, and Councillor Alan Card was re-elected Vice-Chairman.

Many highways matters were discussed, and the Clerk was asked to refer them to the Area Surveyor for action – in particular bad drainage in various locations following the recent heavy rain. The footpath from The Drift to Main Street, Syston was in need of cutting, and grass and weeds are growing through the surface. The grass on the triangles at each end of Syston was also considered to be in need of more regular cutting.

The Clerk updated the Council on consultations on planning applications, and on results. The Parish Council considered the matter raised during the public forum in relation to wind turbines, and confirmed its opposition in principle, although noting that the planning application had not yet been received. The Clerk was asked to register this support with the newly formed Committee, and request to be kept advised.

A quotation had been received for the supply of two replacement seats with commemorative plaques, which the Council considered and accepted. Fixing would be done by local volunteer labour.

The Clerk updated the Council on meetings of the Diamond Jubilee Committee, and on the current format of the celebrations.

The Clerk said that the black and green bins for the Burial Ground had been received and were in use, although there was some misuse -i.e. non-green waste in the green bin. All users are asked to be careful to put the correct waste in the correct bin. He said that the Burial Ground plan had been

checked again and there was consecrated space available on half of the unused southern section.

The Council considered a request for the provision of a defibrillator in the area, and Councillor Bernard Noyes gave background information on the benefits of this scheme and the costs. The Council asked the Clerk to check on any scheme of a similar nature run by "LIVES" and to report to the next meeting.

The Council considered a request for action to be taken to speed up broadband in the area, and for members to be advised of the appropriate contact so that they could request action. Community Lincs is supporting a wide-based lobby for improvements, and the Clerk was asked to check this and report to the next meeting.

The Council received an update on the finances as at the end of the financial year 2011/12 and the position so far for 2012/13 and, having considered them in detail, accepted them and also agreed the statement of assurance required for the audit. The Clerk reported that grants were available for the maintenance of War Memorials, from the War Memorials Trust. A letter had been received from the County Council advising the amount of grant to be paid for verge grass cutting, which the Clerk was asked to check, as it was significantly different to the amount currently paid.

The next meeting is on MONDAY 9^{TH} JULY 2012 at 7.45 pm at the VILLAGE HALL.

Belton and Manthorpe Parish Council

The Parish Council met at Manthorpe Village Hall on Thursday 17th May 2012. Six Councillors and two members of the public were present plus District Councillor Ray Wootten.

Matters pertaining to Belton were as follows:-

Belton Old School – Village Hall: No further progress at the moment. The National Trust had been totally occupied with the changes to the "Ride" and the Carriage hall at the shop at Belton House.

Larkfleet Homes. - 1000 Houses at Manthorpe. The secretary of State has rejected the planning application. All local bodies applauded this decision. A further appeal is thought unlikely.

The Queen's Jubilee Celebration. The Parish Council agreed to make a donation of circa £100 each to Belton and Manthorpe, to go towards the festivities and jubilee mugs for the local children.

Community Lincs - Bulk Oil Buying Scheme Cllr. Hopwell had investigated and reported that there were several schemes of this nature available which required a joining fee of £20. Chandlers were operating a free scheme in the local area which seemed very competitive and there was thus no point in paying for a scheme.

NHS Consultation Community Health Trust. Cllrs. Hopwell and Thompson had attended the Sleaford consultation meeting. Cllr. Hopwell said the changes seemed a good thing, in changing to a bottom up patient driven organisation. The Trust would be driven by patient committees but would rely on the doctors. Theoretically it looked a good thing but could give difficulties in practice.

Crime Levels in Belton. Cllr.Hopwell reported that incidents in the village had decreased however Cllr. Coney said that there had been six burglaries in Belton garden centre in the last two weeks.

Road Surface Noise A607 at Belton Although Highways had advised that no work would be needed for 20 years Ray Wootten said that any new surface would be noisier due to cheaper materials being used. On the stretch from Chandlers to Witham Bridge there is a dip in the surface and Cllr. Wootten would speak to Highways and let the Council know who to report to.

Cllr. Hopwell said he had studied the road surface and there were signs of crazing and breaking up. He found it difficult to believe it would last the 20 years stated.
