

# Not From the Rectory - the Rector heeds advice to 'stay local'

At the time of writing, government guidance is to stay at home but by the end of the month the guidance should be modified to allow us to 'stay local'. It was on some such similar easing of restrictions in 2020 that the Rector took the opportunity of staying local and visiting a place – which despite working for nine years in Lincoln – he had not previously visited and so was able to share Henry Thorold's 'excitement' on catching a first glimpse of Doddington Hall with its three lead domes, rose-red towers and mullioned windows

Henry speaks of Doddington [Lincolnshire Houses] as being one of the most important houses in the county as well as one of the most beautiful: built at the end of the  $16^{th}$  century by the Registrar to the Bishops of Lincoln. On the day of our visit the house was hosting an exhibition of sculpture spread out for the most part around the grounds of the house

We purchased our entrance tickets in the gabled gatehouse but we will have to make a return visit to see inside the house and so pass from Tudor exterior to what Henry promises is the special delight of Doddington - its 18<sup>th</sup> century interior. There is a local connection as Doddington passed by marriage to the Husseys of Honington.

The gardens were a delight – as those who can see the pictures we took can verify – with a guided trail to lead you around and which we extended by dropping into the pasture land beyond the ha-ha wall where Lincoln Red cattle graze and walking west as far as the Pyramid.

Lunch was enjoyed in a Covid secure way at the Coffee Shop which

is situated next door to the Giant Bike Shop where hopefully on a return visit we can hire a bike and take the mile long Georgie Twigg trail and join the National Cycle Network Route 64 which makes use of the former Lancashire, Derbyshire & East Coast Railway line - turning east to enter Lincoln via the former Pyewipe Junction or west to cross the River Trent over the impressive Fledborough Viaduct which has 4 girder spans as well as 59 brick arches and was constructed seemingly with nine million bricks!

As hire bikes were not available due to Covid restrictions we continued by car to trace the route as best we could via the A57 and the A1133 south towards Newark but turning off to pass through North Clifton and so come as close as we could to the viaduct situated [again to quote Henry Thorold] in 'strange, strange country' forming the 'featureless lands' on either side of the Trent.

We parked at Clifton church between North and South Clifton and from the back of the churchyard climbed a perilously unstable stile to take the path the short distance to the river where it peters out – but with, as those who can see the pictures can affirm, the mighty Fledborough Viaduct beyond.

The church of St George the Martyr – now part of the East Trent Benefice of ten churches – is, in Henry words, 'a prominent landmark, solitary, incomprehensible, and [of course] inaccessible' [Shell Guide to Nottinghamshire]!

I think this letter will reach you as the church celebrates the joy of the Easter season: Risen Christ, for whom no door is locked, no entrance barred: open the doors of our hearts, that we may seek the good of others and walk the joyful road of sacrifice and peace.

May the Risen Christ walk with you.

# **BARKSTON AND SYSTON PARISH COUNCIL**

A virtual Meeting of the Parish Council was held on 8<sup>th</sup> March, via 'Zoom'. Eight members of the Parish Council were present, Councillor Evans sending apologies. District Councillor Mrs Rosemary Kaberry-Brown also sent apologies. County Councillor Ray Wootten was present, together with District Councillor Ian Stokes. There were no members of the public present.

The Clerk, as usual, updated members on the progress with various matters in connection with roads and footpaths, which had been raised at previous meetings, and reported that some of the items raised had been dealt with, or works were proposed. A job card had been raised for works on potholes on Minnetts Hill, although it was not known when the works would be done. A broken stile on Hough Road, near the railway crossing, had been replaced with a gate; a request for the footpath adjacent to the A607 north of Barkston to be sided back had been completed; and the County Council had advised that a request for a grit bin near the Station Road/A607 would be considered in the summer when plans for next winter were being dealt with.

It had been noted that during recent bad weather the dyke opposite the Village Hall was blocked along parts of its length, resulting in water flowing in the direction of The Stag. This had been reported to Highways and investigations into ownership were underway.

County Councillor Wootten's 'Councillor calls for action' initiative with regard to the provision of parking at the end of West Street had been successful, in that the Highways Committee had supported the request, and had instructed officers to proceed to further investigations and report back to the Committee after the May elections. Comments from local residents had been received and would be considered at the next meeting, hopefully alongside a report on County Council proposals.

Community Speedwatch was still paused Countywide, at the direction of the Road Safety Partnership, although it was noted that the camera enforcement van would be deployed in Barkston in the near future.
