# **South Cliff Villages Group NOT FROM THE RECTORY**



#### A Month in which the Rector 'bounces back'

Heritage Railways appear to be benefitting from a government 'Bounce Back' scheme and we duly bought our 'Bounce Back' ticket entitling us to a whole compartment on the 11.15 a.m. departure one day in April from Wirksworth to Duffield on the Ecclesbourne Valley Railway.

In truth this was a trip down memory lane for often of a Saturday I would take mother out for a ride in the car and we covered this area of Derbyshire extensively, perhaps enjoying a picnic in the car park at Alport Heights looking over Wirksworth and then dropping down to the town to see the progress on bringing the railway back to life before eventually travelling on the line including most memorably a ride one year on the Santa Special.

The line south would have joined the Midland main line at Duffield but the intention was to take the route north beyond Wirksworth and join the main line north of Rowsley thus by-passing a stretch of line owned by a rival company between Ambergate and Rowsley. As soon as the Midland Railway was able to, it took over the line from Ambergate and so Wirksworth became and remained a short branch line mainly for freight from the lead mines and limestone quarries; for milk from farms along the route and for a small but regular group of commuters.

The last freight train was in 1989 but the lines remained and the Ecclesbourne Valley Railway was formed to bring life back and today our handsome crimson red carriages were hauled by 'Eric'—A Class 14 diesel hydraulic locomotive built in 1965 at Swindon D9537 for shunting duties, latterly working for British Steel before retiring to the East Lancashire Railway but on loan to the Ecclesbourne Valley

Railway.

We can see in the picture we took the beautiful Britsh Railways crest on the carriage side displaying a demi-lion rampant (the British lion) holding between the paws a silver locomotive wheel. The lion is issuant from a heraldic crown of gold on which are arranged the rose (for England), the thistle (for Scotland), the leek (for Wales) and the oak leaf (for all Great Britain).

It is but a short journey to the National Trust property of Hardwick Hall where you would have see the rector doing that which the bishops have instructed – taking some time to rest! We often combine this with a visit to the family grave taking flowers to replace the Christmas wreath.

This letter will be coming out when the church calendar has moved forward into the Trinity season about which John Meade Faulkner [1858-1932] memorably wrote:

We have done with dogma and divinity,
Easter and Whitsun past,
The long, long Sundays after Trinity
Are with us at last;
The passionless Sundays after Trinity,
Neither feast-day nor fast!



#### **What is Community Speed Watch?**

Community Speed Watch is a scheme to allow trained volunteers to address speed concerns in their communities.

Volunteers work in association with the Police and Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership. Warning signs are displayed on the approach to a speed check area, and volunteers wearing high visibility clothing use a speed detection device to record a vehicles speed. Registered keepers of vehicles exceeding the speed limit will be sent letters of advice from the police.

#### Who can be a volunteer?

Anyone who is over 18 can volunteer and full training will be given. Community Speed Watch teams will comprise of a minimum of three trained volunteers, so you will never be expected to work alone.

#### BARKSTON & SYSTON PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual Parish Meeting for the Parishes of Barkston & Syston was held on 24th May in the Village Hall. Councillor Maryan Nussey was in the Chair as Chair of the Parish Council, and there were seven parishioners present. The Clerk read the minutes of the last meeting (2019), and as there were no issues raised by parishioners, the Chair closed the meeting at 7.48 p.m..

The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council followed the Annual Parish Meeting. Seven members of the Parish Council were present, together with the District Councillor Ian Stokes. County Councillor Ray Wootten and District Councillor Rosemary Kaberry-Brown sent apologies. There were no members of the public present.

Councillor Maryan Nussey was re-elected Chair and Councillor Alan Card was re-elected as Vice-Chairman for the ensuing year.

The Clerk, as usual, updated members on the progress with various matters in connection with roads and footpaths, which had been raised at previous meetings. The County Council had programmed works to finally deal with the frequent drainage problems at the A607 junction with Church Street, near The Stag, and at the Minnetts Hill/Church Street junction. Works at the latter area would also include improvements to the area in front of the Bedehouses.

It had been confirmed that the dyke opposite the Village Hall, which was blocked along parts of its length, resulting in water flowing in the direction of The Stag was in fact owned by LCC. Action to deal with the blockage would be taken at the same time as the works referred to above.

County Councillor Wootten's "Councillor calls for action" initiative had been successful in that the Highways Committee had supported the request, and had instructed officers to proceed to further investigate and report back to the Committee after the May Elections. Nothing further had been heard since before the elections, although it was expected that a report would be prepared soon.


