Lincs Trust for Nature Conservation

Barkston and Syston Parish Council

A Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday 13th January 2014. All members of the Parish Council were present. Two members of the public attended, together with Neil Chadwick (HQ Co-ordinator for LIVES), and Chris Townson (Member of the newly formed Barkston LIVES Group).

The meeting commenced with the public forum, during which a member of the public drew the attention of the Council to the recently submitted application for an Environmental Impact Assessment for the Temple Hill Turbine application, and also to a further application for 13/14 turbines on Fulbeck Airfield.

The two LIVES representatives then made a brief presentation to update on the Group's progress. There were 5 members of the group currently, all trained to level 2, and fully equipped, including with a defibrillator. The operating area was within 2 miles of Barkston, and the ideal would be a 24/7 coverage, although at the moment it was less than that in an average week. Finances were mentioned, and it was noted that the group were relying on the Parish Councils in the area, and others, and it was hoped to eventually move to self-financing. It was intended to undertake local publicity via a leaflet drop, which would include an envelope for donations. It was intended to approach the School to ask them to make LIVES their chosen charity. The group would probably need £1,000 to function, for example it would cost £350 to kit everyone in the group out with appropriate uniform, which added to the credibility of the group, as well as being practical. Running costs -2oxygen cylinders cost £168 per year and defibrillator pads £25 per time. In addition, LIVES HQ took 30% for HQ funding. A request was made for £1,000 for each of the next two years.

Highways matters were discussed, and the Council were advised that in regard to the footpath in front of the Bedehouses, nothing further had been heard. Councillor Wootten undertook to pursue this with the Area Surveyor. On a related matter, the Clerk and Councillor Wootten agreed to refer the very uneven and potholed surface of Church Street and Honington Road to the Area Surveyor for urgent action.

Work to reinstate the double yellow lines at the A607 end of Church Street had still not taken place, and the Clerk was asked to again remind the Area Surveyor. The order to install double yellow lines around the Church corner on Church Street/Honington Road would be processed in the next batch Witham. The matter rests with the Trust/Highways. Flooding Five Gates Road at Alma Road End. R Wootten reported to Highways. Dangerous state of road from Belton to Five Gates, Clerk to write to Highways.

Correspondense: Planning Permission given for change to outhouse at Vine Cottage, Washdyke Lane, Belton.

The next Parish Meeting (AGM) will be held on May 15th 2014 at Belton Village Hall starting at 7.00 p.m.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 8.55 p.m.

Barkston War Memorial Cleaning Scrap Metal Fund Raising

The Parish Council recently decided that as part of the commemoration of the 100^{th} anniversary of the 1st World War the Barkston War Memorial should be cleaned. The cleaning works have to be undertaken professionally to prescribed specifications, with the consequent costs involved, provisionally estimated at around £1000.00.

For a year or so Pete Wheeler, Arthur West and myself have been collecting odds and ends of scrap metal, washing machines, tumble driers, electric motors, cookers, cable, batteries and gates—indeed anything metallic other than fridges and freezers and taking the collection into the scrap metal yard and raising money for local organizations. To date St Nicholas Church Restoration Fund and the newly formed LIVES group have both received contributions.

Our current focus is to raise money towards the cleaning costs of the War Memorial. We have a target of $\pounds 100.00$ in mind. To date we have $\pounds 25.00$ in the kitty. That will not go far!

If you can help by donating any metallic items to the cause please don't hesitate to either contact one of us, if the item is too heavy for you to deliver personally, or simply drop the bits and pieces onto my driveway at Derwent, Church Street, Barkston.

Belton and Manthorpe Parish Council

The Parish Council met at Manthorpe Village Hall, on Thursday 13th February 2014. Five Councillors, a member of the public and County Councillor Ray Wootten were present.

Matters pertaining to Belton were as follows:-

Belton Old School—Village Hall : The work is completed but the car park is in a poor state at the moment. National Trust has a plan to resolve the situation and lay the car park out as per the planning permission. However the roadway remains very muddy in the current weather conditions.

Crime Levels: Nothing to report. R Wootten informed the Parish Council that there is a new Beat Manager for Manthorpe and (he believes) Belton, Pete Nettleton. Public can log onto www.police.ukbeatmanager with postcode to find out what the crime levels are in their area.

Excess Water on A607: R Wootten reported that the order to get the grips done to stop the excess water on the A607 has been out for some time but it is not a priority and will be done when possible.

Parking Problem in Belton Main St: R Wootten wrote to Mark Heaton of Highways and emails were sent by Michael Coney trying to find a solution to the problem. Highways felt that the only form of enforcement that would be effective and recognizable to all motorists was the use of yellow lines.

Eventually it was agreed to further pursue with Highways the possibility of use of 50mm primrose double yellow lines from the Witham Bridge as far as Towthorpe Farm entrance possibly with parking bays. The National trust are aware of the situation and intend to do their best to alleviate parking problems at the Old School and Belton House. Michael Coney would like Councillors to have an on-site meeting with Bryan Gault, the Area Officer from Highways to discuss the proposal. Clerk to write to Mr Gault and arrange for him to contact Michael Coney. Copy of letter to be sent to Alec Gordon, National Trust.

Any Other Business: Flooding in Belton between Belton House entrance and the A607. Ray Wootten had obtained a reply from Highways that they

After the road was resurfaced. The County Council had advised that they were looking into various alternatives to avoid damage to the wall of Pear Tree Farm. The Clerk said that local businesses had been made aware of the problem, and asked to take appropriate action in regard to any of their own vehicles, or visiting vehicles.

ea Surveyor had promised gully emptying and jetting to improve the flooding on the Stag corner. The Clerk was asked to remind the Area Surveyor that the flooding really started with blocked drains further up the A607, where soil and leaves washed down from the fields to the east. Repair work to The Close was programmed for the next financial year. The undergrounding of overhead cables in Syston had been referred to Western Power although a response had not yet been received.

Other issues discussed were flooding at the garage and on Hough Road, surfacing of River Lane, Syston, and the repair of the long-damaged "School" sign on Honington Road were mentioned for referral to the Area Surveyor

The new plan of the Burial Ground had been prepared, and the agreed small changes to the operating rules had been notified to local Funeral Directors. The Clerk's changes to the Burial Grant form to require next of kin to be responsible for the maintenance of memorials were discussed, and the Clerk was asked to research the definition of next of kin as applied to this issue, and also the average cost of headstone repairs.

It was agreed that, as part of the commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the 1st World War, in addition to the cleaning of the Memorial, research would be undertaken into the history of the names. The Syston Memorial also to be researched.

The Council agreed a precept of £9,050 for the year 2014/15. It was also agreed to make a contribution to LIVES from the Charity Account in the sum of £1,000 in the current year, and to consider a contribution in a similar amount at the Charity distribution for 2014/15 later in the year.

The next meeting is on MONDAY 10^{th} MARCH 2014 at 7.45 pm at the VILLAGE HALL.
