Belton and Manthorpe Parish Council

The Parish Council met at Manthorpe Village Hall, on Thursday 22nd November 2012. Six Councillors and one member of the public were present plus District Councillor Ray Wootten.

Matters pertaining to Belton were as follows:-

Belton Old School – Village Hall. Planning Application has been approved with conditions. There is no timescale as yet for the work to be done.

Road Surface Noise A607. The road in the vicinity of the Witham river bridge has been built up to remove a dip and resurfaced. Villagers have reported a decrease in road noise and are much happier with the results.

NHS Consultation Community Health Trust. Cllr Wootten reported that there are proposals to keep A&E at Grantham Hospital for the next 20 years. There will be better facilities for outpatients, additional children's wards and a Day Care Centre will be opened. They are, however, proposing to close the Maternity Unit. There will be various consultation events until April next year.

Councillor Hopwell said that he had read the consultation report which seemed to make sense given the low level of hospital births at Grantham. However, he wondered whether this was a self fulfilling prophesy since it seemed that mothers had been dissuaded from using Grantham due to possible risk if there were complications. This had resulted in mothers going to the larger local hospitals and hence a low level of births at Grantham. He felt that a growing town like Grantham should have a full maternity unit.

Crime Levels in Belton. Belton much quieter but M. Coney had 2 sheep troughs stolen over the last couple of nights.

Street Lighting in Belton: Lights have been repaired and SKDC have confirmed that it is responsible for all lights in Belton.

CORRESPONDENCE

Gritting Routes 2012/13. Belton on the list but Cllr Wootten to have a word to give Belton more priority. Councillor Hopwell said that "Highways" had refused to put Belton on the gritting route because their lorries could only do the existing route on their one load of grit/salt. However their existing route included Syston which probably had less need for gritting than Belton. Councillor Hopwell said his proposal was that Syston/Belton should be gritted on alternate gritting runs. Cllr Wootten to take this up.

Planning Application No S12/2589 Automation of Existing Entrance Gates – Belton House. No objections.

that there had only been 4 replies, the Council decided to take no further action or to back any event financially.

Funding for broadband improvements was progressing, and Members were being kept advised by regular emails from OnLincolnshire.

The Council received the regular update on the finances so far for 2012/13 and, having considered them in detail, accepted them. The budget consideration was deferred to January 2013 to enable Members to give some thought to items they wished to put forward for consideration, and to enable the Clerk to investigate prices and obtain quotations if necessary. Appropriate amendments to the Financial Regulations were agreed. The Internal Audit Plan was also agreed.

The next meeting is on MONDAY 14th JANUARY 2013 at 7.45 pm at the VIL-LAGE HALL.

Barkston and Syston Parish Council

The Parish Council met at the Village Hall on Monday12th November 2012. All members of the Parish Council were present, together with County Councillor Ray Wootten and District Councillor Trevor Scott for part of the meeting. One member of the public attended.

The meeting commenced with the public forum. The member of the public raised awareness of the SKDC Wind Energy Supplementary Planning Document, mentioning for consideration later the effect on birds and other wildlife of the Frinkley Lane turbine, and the fact that it failed to turn at optimum speed most of the time. He reminded the meeting that the Carlton Scroop application had been refused, but that other applications were in the pipeline.

Many highways matters were discussed, and the Clerk was asked to refer them to the Area Surveyor for action. The situation regarding Bridleway No. 4 leading to Marston, was discussed. The County Council were only prepared to erect signs warning of the penalties for misuse, and the request for a meeting to discuss the issue of a permanent barrier was not agreed. The Clerk was to write to the Area Surveyor to pursue the request for a gate. The Area Surveyor had sent a plan showing the precise location of the central refuge in Barkston, which was discussed and agreed. It was noted that the works would not commence until June/July 2013, delayed from April to accommodate other works and the reactive speed signs.

The fly tipping on Minnetts Hill had been the subject of action by SKDC, and a prosecution was pending. It was agreed to continue to monitor the area. The visibility issue from St Nicholas Close onto Church Street had improved in that the overhanging vegetation had been cleared. The Area Surveyor was not able to authorise a mirror on the public highway.

The Area Surveyor had advised that 20mph limits could not be imposed in The Drift, Syston, although 30mph repeater signs could be installed. The Council asked the Clerk to repeat the request, pointing out the danger to children. Other matters raised included a request to continue the new path on Honington Road, which had been improved, but which stopped at the Bede Houses, pointing out the danger from water and mud on the unimproved stretch of path.

The Council considered the SKDC Supplementary Planning Document on Wind Energy and opposed the erection of more wind farms in principle, in view of their proven inefficiency. The Clerk was asked to produce a response based on the Council's previous objections to the turbines at Frinkley Lane and Carlton Scroop and circulate it for Members to consider.

The possible repeat of the Fun Day in 2013 was considered and, bearing in mind

ANY OTHER BUSINESS:

The problem of water not soaking away and flooding the road halfway between Belton House entrance and the river was again raised. The Clerk had written to Highways on this matter. Cllr Wootton to take up this matter.

Note. Since the meeting, Highways have written to say that they have investigated the drainage system in the area and are now preparing a re-build of the old drainage system to hopefully overcome the problem.

There being no further business the meeting was closed at 9.00pm. The next meeting will be on February 14th, 2013 at 7.30pm.
