From the Rectory

My copy is due to the editor on 19 April, which my calendar informs me is the feast day of Alphege, Archbishop of Canterbury. Alphege died a martyr's death in the year 1012, which is a reminder that not all holders of that office have met with a quiet retirement. It also acted as a reminder of the visit we made to the home of later archbishops at the Palace of Lambeth.

The red Tudor gatehouse, seen in most TV broadcasts, was built by Cardinal Morton in about 1490 while the most modern addition is the glazed roof courtvard known as the Atrium, opened by the Prince of Wales in 2000. This connects the main Palace buildings, which date from the time of Archbishop Howley (1833), to the 13th century chapel and crypt. The chapel ceiling was damaged by an incendiary bomb during World War II and has now been replaced with an artwork entitled 'From Darkness to Light'. A small room overlooking the chapel was used by Archbishop Thomas Cranmer and is thought to be the room where he compiled the first Book of Common Prayer.

One of the main rooms we visited was the Great Hall, which houses the Lambeth Palace Library and was restored following bomb damage during World War II. Part of the visit includes the extensive gardens of the palace, which have the distinction of being the oldest continuously cultivated gardens in the capital. As well as this chapel, prayer and worship is also offered in the Crypt Chapel below although it only came into use as such after the bomb damage referred to above. This is the oldest part of the building and today has a fresco of Christ in Glory given by Pope Paul VI to Archbishop Michael Ramsey in 1966.

The other public or state rooms we visited on the tour included the Guard Room in which the First Lambeth Conference was held, the Pink Drawing Room as well as the State Dining Room and State Drawing Room.

The archbishop has a private apartment, which is not a part of the tour though from the smell of burnt Welsh rarebit we hazarded a guess that Rowan was perhaps in residence!

Barkston and Syston Parish Council

The Parish Council met at the Village Hall on Monday 11th March 2013. Eight members of the Parish Council were present, together with County Councillor Ray Wootten and District Councillor Trevor Scott for part of the meeting. Seven members of the public also attended.

The meeting commenced with a public forum. Mrs Kerry Walmsley of the SKDC Conservation Team attended to explain the proposals for extensions to the Barkston Conservation Area and to answer questions from members of the public. The existing area had been designated in 2001 and the District Council had a statutory duty to review all such areas.

There were three proposed extensions – a large area around The Grange and The Granary, a smaller area to the north of Pear Tree Farm and an area on Honington Road from the Bede Houses to the junction with the A607, including the Burial Ground. Residents made many points in relation to the proposals, and these comments and SKDC responses can be read in the full minutes (available on the Parish Council website).

The Parish Council considered the proposal later in the meeting and resolved to support the objections put forward by residents and oppose the extension of the Conservation Area as proposed for the areas around The Grange and The Granary and the area to the north of Pear Tree Farm, but to raise no objection to the eastern extension off Honington Road, subject to the exclusion of Safari Lodge, as agreed by Mrs Walmsley.

Many highways matters were discussed, and the Clerk was asked to refer them to the Area Surveyor for action. The road to Barkston Gorse was to be repaired with the largest depressions filled. The situation regarding Bridleway No. 4 leading to Marston was again discussed. The Clerk was requested to refer the continued illegal use by 4WD vehicles/motorbikes to the Area Surveyor with a request that the previously suggested gate be installed – despite earlier refusals. Concern was expressed about the poor state of the path in front of the Bede Houses at Barkston, which was continually flooded in wet weather and presented a danger to pedestrians. Local residents had also complained and the Clerk was asked to again refer the matter to the Area Surveyor.

The Clerk was asked to continue to press for action to slow traffic in The Drift, Syston. Other matters raised included damage to verges in Syston and West Street, Barkston; erosion of the bank on the corner of Church Street, Barkston by the War Memorial (parent parking); new footpath across the corner of the A607/Honington Road junction and investigations into a possible bus shelter on Church Street, Barkston.
